- SUBJECT: 2023 Updates to Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) Adult Immunization Recommendations and VFA Vaccine Policy; New CDC Hepatitis B Screening Guidance

Dear VFA Provider,

1. <u>ACIP 2023 Adult Immunization Schedule.</u>- Key updates include:

- Addition of COVID-19 vaccine primary series and booster to the routine adult schedule.
- Updated pneumococcal vaccine recommendations for people who previously received PCV13.
- Preferential recommendation for high dose, adjuvanted, or recombinant influenza vaccine for people age 65 years and older.
- Addition of new vaccines: Priorix (Measles, Mumps, Rubella; available from VFA) and PreHevbrio (Hepatitis B; not available in VFA).
- <u>Guidance</u> for additional doses of MMR vaccine during a mumps outbreak.
- <u>Guidance</u> for the use of inactivated poliovirus vaccine (IPV) in people 18 years of age and older who are at increased risk for exposure to polio viruses.
- Guidance that serologic evidence of prior varicella is not necessary for zoster vaccination.
- Guidance describing the use of JYNNEOS vaccine for mpox prevention in at-risk populations.

2. <u>Pneumococcal Conjugate Vaccine (PCV) or Polysaccharide Vaccine (PPSV) Updates</u>

 ACIP recommendations, summarized in updated <u>CDC</u> and <u>CDPH</u> Pneumococcal Vaccine Timing job aids, help clarify the use of PCV20 after receipt of PCV13 or PPSV23:

Vaccination Status	Option 1	Option 2
Received PCV13 and PPSV23 more than 5 years ago	PCV20	PPSV23
Adults 19 years and older; received PCV13 more than 1 year ago	PCV20	PPSV23

Availability through VFA during the quarterly ordering period closing on April 14, 2023

- PCV20 (Prevnar 20[™], Pfizer): 10-packs of single dose syringes available.
- PCV15 (Vaxneuvance[™], Merck): not offered.
- PPSV23 (Pneumovax[®]23): not offered.



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3. JYNNEOS Vaccine for Mpox:

- Is given as two doses, with at least 28 days between each dose.
- Should be offered to persons at risk for exposure to mpox, especially persons living with HIV and other causes of immunosuppression.
- Should be offered to persons exposed to mpox, preferably within 4 days of exposure but can be offered up to 14 days post-exposure.
- Can be ordered via myCAvax. Please contact <u>mpoxvaccine@cdph.ca.gov</u> for more information.

4. <u>Td Vaccine (TDVAX) Shortage Update</u>

- After distribution of Td vaccine was interrupted from December 2022 to March 2023, CDC has instituted temporary ordering controls to manage limited supplies.
- CDC recommends the use of Tdap vaccine in lieu of Td vaccine whenever possible, at least until ordering controls are no longer needed.
 - Tdap vaccine is an acceptable alternative to Td, including for wound management.
 - The limited supply of Td vaccine needs to be preserved for those with a <u>specific</u> <u>contraindication to pertussis-containing vaccines</u>, the only persons for whom Tdap vaccine is not an acceptable alternative.

5. <u>New CDC Hepatitis B Screening Guidelines</u>

- <u>One-time screening of all adults is now recommended</u>, utilizing a "triple panel" of:
 - hepatitis B surface antigen (HBsAg).
 - antibody to hepatitis B surface antigen (anti-HBs)
 - total antibody to hepatitis B core antigen (total anti-HBc).
- Persons with ongoing risk may be retested periodically.
- <u>New recommendation</u> for triple panel screening of pregnant people.
- <u>United States Preventive Services Task Force</u> (USPSTF) continues to recommend screening of adults based on risk factors described in previous <u>CDC recommendations</u>. <u>California Iaw (AB 789)</u> requires hepatitis B screening based on USPSTF guidance.
- <u>CDC recommends hepatitis B vaccination for all adults 19-59 years</u> who screen negative for hepatitis B. The first vaccine dose can be given on the same day as screening tests are ordered. Blood should be drawn before vaccine administration.
