SUBJECT: **Update EHR Immunization Fields: Support Providers to Comply with New Requirement**

Dear EHR Vendor,

[AB 1797](#), a new California law, now requires providers enter in a California immunization registry ([CAIR](#) OR [Healthy Futures/RIDE](#)):

- Records on immunizations they administer
- Race and ethnicity of immunized patients
- Tuberculosis (TB) testing results

To support these requirements, please update your EHR as follows:

1. HL7 code for Race and Ethnicity Fields

If a patient declines to state race and/or ethnicity, CAIR2 is adding a new category of “Prefer not to say” to the CAIR2 user interface and via HL7. **Please update the race and ethnicity fields using [this HL7 code](#) to include “Prefer not to say” as a category.**

2. TB Testing Results

Please update your EHR fields to collect any TB results (including IGRA test results) and enable results to be submitted.

3. Cell Phone Numbers

Please make sure EHR fields specify cell phone number when collecting patient phone numbers. Capturing cell phone numbers may enable reminder/recall immunization notices, access to digital vaccine records through the [portal](#) and other public health measures.

Of note, the California Department of Public Health is making grants available to [Vaccines for Children \(VFC\) providers](#) only who are not yet enrolled to become COVID-19 vaccine providers.
