





Updated Q: What is the difference between an "additional dose" and a "booster dose?"

A: An additional dose of the COVID-19 vaccine is administered when the immune response following a primary vaccination series is likely to be insufficient. An additional dose is recommended for immunocompromised individuals at least 28 days after completing their initial mRNA COVID-19 vaccine series (PfizerBioNTech and Moderna vaccines). A booster dose is administered when the initial sufficient immune response to a primary vaccination series is likely to have waned. The CDC recommends the use of a single Pfizer-BioNTech booster dose at least 6 months after completion of the primary series for the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine only. The Janssen vaccine by Johnson & Johnson has not been authorized for additional doses or boosters. To access a chart with booster dose and additional dose eligibility information, please visit COVID-19 Vaccine Eligibility Chart.



Q: How does the CDC define high-risk occupations that qualify individuals for COVID-19 Pfizer booster doses?

A: According to the CDC, examples of high-risk occupations that qualify individuals for Pfizer booster doses include first responders, education staff, food and agriculture workers, manufacturing workers, corrections workers, U.S. postal service workers, public transit workers, and grocery store workers. 

Doses Administered to Date (10/13/21)

- 79.6% of 12+ population has received at least one dose and 71.7% are fully protected!
- 81.9% of 65+ population has received at least one dose and 74.5% are fully protected.
- 65.2% of 12-to-17-year-olds have received at least one dose and 57.1% are fully protected.
 - Opportunities to still vaccinate 1,097,688 12-to-17-year-olds (34.8% eligible population)

Booster Doses:

- 803,270 Pfizer Booster total doses administered since September 24,2021
- 278,663 Pfizer booster doses administered October 4-10, equaling 47% of total doses administered last week.
- Age 65 + Majority population receiving Pfizer booster doses (61%)
- VEM Quartile 4 has the largest volume of booster doses being administered at 38% and 13.1% in VEM Quartile 1.
- Pharmacies are administering majority of booster doses (54%) followed by Medical Practices at 27%.






Vaccine Equity Metric

- 73.4% of Q1 population has received at least one dose with 63.7% fully protected.
- 76.9% of Q2 population has received at least one dose with 69% fully protected.
- Vaccine Equity Metric disparities are much steeper in younger age groups



From 9/26/21 - 10/2/21, unvaccinated people were **7.0 times more likely** to get COVID-19 than fully vaccinated people.



From 9/12/21 - 9/18/21, unvaccinated people were **18.7 times more likely** to die from COVID-19 than fully vaccinated people.

Flu Vaccine Announcement

Annual flu vaccine is recommended for anyone 6 months of age and older.

Getting vaccinated against flu is particularly important for people at high-risk of severe disease and hospitalization, including:

- People 65 years and older
- People who smoke or have underlying medical conditions
- Pregnant women and children under 5 years of age
- Caregivers and residents in long-term care facilities
- Essential workers who encounter others outside their homes or are at higher risk because of their occupation

Interim Clinical Considerations for Use of COVID-19 Vaccines | CDC

Additional dose:

- Administer when the immune response following a primary vaccine series is likely to be insufficient.
- Recommended for moderately to severely immunocompromised people at least 28 days after an initial 2-dose mRNA primary vaccine series.


Booster dose:

- Administer when the initial sufficient immune response to a primary vaccine series is likely to have waned over time.
- No recommendation for immunocompromised who have received an additional dose to receive a booster dose at this time → No more than 3 doses per person



CDPH Booster Guidance Posted

- Vaccines Coronavirus COVID-19
 Response (ca.gov)
- SHOULD receive booster:
 - ∘ 65 or older, or
 - Long-term care resident 18 and over
 - 50-64 and have an underlying medical condition, or
 - 50-64 and at increased risk due to social inequity (including that of communities of color)





CDPH Booster Guidance Posted

MAY receive booster:

- 18-49 and have an underlying medical condition or are at increased risk due to social inequity, or
- 18-64 and work or live in a high-risk setting (like a shelter)
- CDC defines <u>high-risk jobs</u> as:
 - First responders (healthcare workers, firefighters, police, congregate care staff)
 - Education staff (teachers, support staff, daycare workers)
 - Food and agriculture workers
 - Manufacturing workers
 - Corrections workers
 - U.S. Postal Service workers
 - Public transit workers
 - Grocery store workers

Moderna Booster Doses – Ancillary Supplies

- Moderna booster doses will likely be a half dose (.25mL)
- Federal government plans to send out future shipments of Moderna
 - after boosters are approved with double the ancillary supplies
 - Don't recommend stockpiling Moderna in advance of the announcement
- Providers who will be using Moderna already in inventory may need to use their own syringe/needle supply for boosters
 - Must be 1 mL syringes
- FDA may approve pulling around 20 booster doses from the vial



Moderna Extension

- Currently a mystery nothing in writing yet and the Moderna website has not updated expiration dates
- CDC told us that Moderna was going to start uploading the new lot numbers into their expiry checker on 10/13
- No formal announcement or list of lot numbers will be provided
- Please hold onto recently expired Moderna in your inventory and keep checking to see if your lots were updated

- The current formulation (purple cap) is authorized for use in those aged 12 and older.


• If the vaccine receives emergency use authorization for children 5-to-11 years, a separate vaccine formulation (orange cap) specific for a 10mcg dose will be introduced.

Note: Use of the current formulation (purple cap) to prepare doses for children 5-11 years would result in an injection volume for the 10mcg dose of 0.1mL, which is considered too small for typical IM injections and has not been studied.


Preparing for COVID-19 Vaccine for 5-to-11-year-olds

What we know:

- Multiple vaccine manufacturers are currently developing COVID-19 vaccines for children <12 years old; however, the Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) application for the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine for children 5-11 years submitted to the FDA may receive authorization before other vaccines
 - Authorization may occurr as soon as end of October/early November
 - Vaccine pre-orders, based on an initial allocated supply to states, will be done in waves, starting mid next week
 - Shipment for pediatric vaccines can begin once the FDA issues the EUA
 - Vaccine administration in California can begin once the CDC Director and the <u>Western States Scientific and Safety Review Workgroup</u> (WSSSRW) issue their independent recommendations.



Preparing for COVID-19 Vaccine for 5-to-11-year-olds



Coming Soon . .

In anticipation, we are preparing necessary:

- MyCAvax system changes (i.e., Adding new Pfizer Pediatric 5-11
 Yr product, allocations and pre-ordering capabilities)
- Provider updates & readiness guidance
- Will include vaccine information, pre-ordering guidance, ordering timelines for the pediatric vaccine formulation, and other COVID-19 vaccines*
 - *NOTE: To support increased logistics needed to push out large number of pediatric doses during the first week, no orders for Pfizer adult vaccine shipments (1170 product configuration) will be distributed during the first few days of the pediatric product launch (exact dates to be determined based on timing of FDA authorization).

Known Issue

Location Application (Section B) Not Sending to Primary Location Coordinator

- When a Provider completes the location application (Section B), no eSignature email is sent to the primary location coordinator.
- ✓ When a Provider returns to the location application and selects the Re-send DocuSign button, no feedback is received on the screen and no eSignature email is sent to the primary location coordinator.



✓ Providers should notify the Helpdesk. Once notified, Providers will receive a link to complete the DocuSign for Section B.


