



What is the Bridge Access Program (BAP)?







Background on the Bridge Access Program (BAP)

On April 18, 2023, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) announced the HHS Bridge Access Program (BAP) for COVID-19 Vaccines and Treatments. BAP is a temporary measure created to prevent loss of access to free COVID-19 vaccines and treatment for uninsured and underinsured aged 19 years and older. The program will begin September 2023 and will end on December 31, 2024.








Beginning BAP Enrollment

list of BAP-eligible program
locations that you manage.

NOTE: The popup will only appear for Organization Vaccine Coordinators and Primary Vaccine Coordinators for the Bridge Access Program.












Estimating the Number of Uninsured and Underinsured Patients



To estimate the number of uninsured and underinsured patients served by your location:



LHDs:

Review your historical 317 usage and look at the estimates provided in your yearly recertification.

VFA Sites:

Check estimates provided in your yearly recertification.

Other Providers:

Contact your billing department for information about your patient population





Contact Updates and Completing Enrollment

If you are a BAP-eligible Provider who cannot access myCAvax, contact the Provider Call Center to confirm your account is active.

Once in myCAvax, if you do not see the enrollment pop-up, contact the Provider Call Center to confirm your Contact has the appropriate Program Role.

Only Organization Vaccine Coordinators and Primary Vaccine Coordinators for BAP will be able to enroll their locations.

NOTE: Novavax vaccine is not yet available through BAP and will be available for ordering at a future date.

Federal contracts have been modified to allow a sooner delivery of the 2023-2024 COVID-19 vaccines within public health infrastructure for children and adults.

Updated CDC Vaccine contract information has been posted, and for adult populations, current products are included in the list.





BAP Vaccine Management



Unlike the previous U.S. Government COVID-19 vaccine program, spoiled and expired COVID-19 doses must be returned to McKesson. Wasted doses should be wasted following local regulations and practice protocols for the disposal of regulated medical waste.

BAP Providers will be required to account for all COVID-19 vaccine doses ordered including reporting on-hand inventory, and doses administered.





BAP Vaccine Shipment and Deliveries

Moderna and Novavax vaccines will be shipped by McKesson.

- COVID-19 vaccine orders will follow same shipping timelines for routine vaccines (shipping approximately within 3 days of order receipt at McKesson).
- Moderna (SPIKEVAX®) vaccine ships frozen between -50°C and -15°C (-58°F and 5°F).
- Novavax vaccine ships like other routine refrigerated vaccines at temperatures between 2° to 8°C (36° to 46°F).


Pfizer vaccines will ship directly from Pfizer

- Will be shipped on dry ice on ultra low temperature conditions.
- CDC contract stipulates vaccines must be delivered within 15 days of order receipt by CDC.
- For vaccines with diluent (6m-4y)
 diluent will be shipped separately
 and will arrive at the same time of
 before vaccines arrive.





BAP Vaccine Storage Capacities



- When ordering, ensure that you have enough vaccine storage space to accommodate your routine adult vaccines, flu vaccine, private-purchase vaccines and COVID vaccines.
- Monitor vaccine storage units regularly and purchase additional storage units if capacity cannot accommodate inventory.






Provider BAP Vaccine Ordering Timeline

CDPH is awaiting additional Bridge Access Program vaccine allocation. We anticipate BAP vaccine ordering will be available to Providers the week of **Monday**, **September 18**, **2023**. Expect ordering updates from CDPH via email.

To prepare to order, Providers must:



*NOTE: Required CDC product training has not been released. For now, review vaccine fact sheets.

**IMPORTANT: Providers that would like to receive COVID-19 vaccines from BAP must be enrolled in the program and receive vaccines directly. No redistribution of BAP supplied vaccines is allowed.






Ordering BAP Vaccine

BAP Providers will order COVID-19 vaccine using the same order process (as USG COVID-19 vaccine) in myCAvax.

Navigate to the Vaccine Orders page, select the COVID-19 program, and click 'New Orders'. Then, input the required information and submit your request.

NOTE: All COVID-19 products will be offered to California BAP Providers for ordering, as supply permits.





Program Overview

On April 18, 2023, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) announced the HHS Bridge Access Program (BAP) for COVID-19 Vaccines and Treatments. The BAP is a temporary measure connected to the commercialization of COVID-19 vaccines and treatment. It was created to prevent loss of access to free COVID-19 vaccines and treatment for uninsured and underinsured aged 19 years and older. The program will begin September 2023 and will end on December 31, 2024. More detailed information can be found at the CDC's Bridge Access Program Page, and in the CDPH BAP Requirements at a Glance.

The State program will utilize existing public health infrastructure, HRSA-supported health centers, and participating pharmacies via two major components:

- Provide support for the existing public section vaccine safety net, implemented and maintained by state immunization programs and HRSAsupported health centers.
- Create a funded partnership with pharmacy chains that will enable them to
 continue offering free COVID-19 vaccinations and treatments. This is a
 separate component under federal contract with key pharmacy chains.
 Participating chains will be able to provide COVID-19 vaccines to uninsured
 adult populations as well. All information on this landing page addresses the
 public health component.

CA Bridge Access Program: At a Glance

Requirements at a Glance



This document will be continuously updated as information and new resources become available

COVID-19 vaccine product and CDC's Vaccine Product Training will be posted after FDA authorization/CDC recommendation.

Who's Eligible: Providers serving uninsured/underinsured adults through public health departments, Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs)/Rural Health Centers, tribal clinics, Indian Health Services sites, and additional providers deemed eligible by LHDs

What You Need to Know: The California Bridge Access Program provides no-cost COVID-19 vaccines to uninsured/underinsured adults (19 years and older) served by enrolled and approved providers. Vaccine supply is limited. Insured patients—including patients covered by Medicare and Medi-Cal—are NOT eligible. Providers must conduct eligibility screening and proper documentation with each administration to ensure vaccines go to eligible adults. Limited supplies of the updated monovalent (XBB subvariant) COVID-19 vaccine will be provided through two components of the state program:

Program Components:

- Public Health Component: Coordinated by State Immunization Programs, in collaboration with existing public health infrastructure. CDPH will allocate to each LHD doses of COVID-19 vaccines based on federally provided vaccine purchase funding limits. Doses allocated will support vaccination of uninsured and under-insured populations at local health departments, FQHCs/RHCs, Tribal and IHS clinics, and other safety net providers selected by LHDs for enrollment in the CA Bridge Access Program.
- Pharmacy component: Independently coordinated by CDC with 3 contracted pharmacy chains/organizations: CVS, Walgreens, and E-True North (for independent and other pharmacies), who will receive supplies replenished by the COVID-19 Vaccine manufacturers directly; the specific sites receiving vaccine are not yet determined, and enrollment information is still forthcoming. All information in this document addresses the public health component.




