

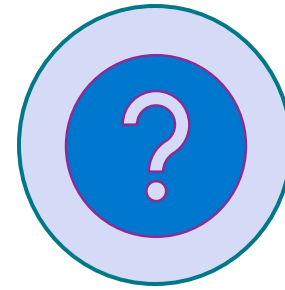

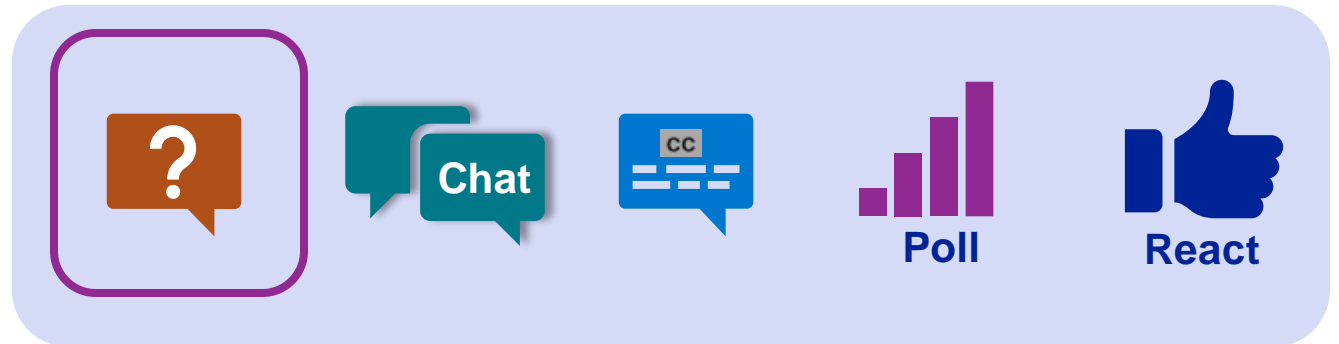

Updated Guidance on Recommended Specimens for Human Avian Influenza A(H5N1) Testing
4/2/2025

Key Messages

- This document provides updated Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidance on recommended specimens for human avian influenza A(H5N1) testing.
- In the prior instructions, persons with conjunctivitis who had conjunctival swab(s) collected, were also required to have respiratory specimens collected even if they had no other symptoms. It is no longer necessary to collect respiratory specimens from persons whose only symptom is conjunctivitis.
- This document supersedes the guidance on recommended specimens to collect for human avian influenza A(H5N1) testing in the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) December 6, 2024 Evaluation and Testing for Human Avian Influenza A(H5N1) Infection.

Background

On March 20, 2025, CDC published updated instructions for use for the CDC Human Influenza Virus Real-Time RT-PCR Diagnostic Panel (CDC Flu rRT-PCR Dx Panel) Influenza A/H5 Subtyping Kit (VER 4).

In the prior instructions for use, persons with conjunctivitis who had conjunctival swab(s) collected, were also required to have respiratory specimens collected even if they had no other symptoms. It is no longer necessary to collect respiratory specimens from persons whose only symptom is conjunctivitis.

Specimens for Human Influenza A(H5N1)

If the CDC H5 subtyping assay* is used, conjunctival swabs alone may be tested in persons who have conjunctivitis and no other symptoms and a strong epidemiological reason to suspect H5N1 infection.

Persons with conjunctivitis and respiratory and/or non-specific symptoms (e.g., fever, headache), should continue to have conjunctival and respiratory specimens collected.

Persons without conjunctivitis but who have respiratory and/or non-specific symptoms (e.g., fever, headache), should continue to have respiratory specimens collected.

Respiratory specimens recommended by CDPH for H5 subtype testing:

- Separate oropharyngeal and anterior nares swabs are preferred (combining both swabs into a single transport media tube is also acceptable).
- Nasopharyngeal swabs are acceptable, but to date have had a lower yield for positive test results in cases than oropharyngeal or anterior nares swabs.

*Only public health laboratories in California are using the CDC H5 subtyping assay. Commercial and academic laboratories are using their own laboratory-developed H5 subtyping assays.

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California Health Alert Network (CAHAN)

The California Health Alert Network (CAHAN) is the official public health alerting and notification program for California. CAHAN is designed for emergency preparedness information sharing, distribution of pertinent public health related events and alerting materials, dissemination of treatment and prevention guidelines, coordinated disease investigation efforts, preparedness planning and other initiatives that strengthen state and local preparedness. The priority health communication distribution through the health communication system is ranked into three different levels of communications based on noted definitions.

Enrollment is limited to administration and select staff with emergency preparedness roles in State agencies, local health jurisdictions and California Department of Public Health (CDPH) licensed health care facilities.

Level of communication types

Alert: Conveys the highest level of importance. Warrants immediate action or attention.

Advisory: Provides important information for a specific incident or situation. May not require immediate action.

Update: Provides updated information regarding an incident or situation. Unlikely to require immediate action along with general information that is not considered to be of an emergent nature.

Other Health Advisories

- All Facilities Letters** - An All Facilities Letter (AFL) is a communication from the Center for Health Care Quality (CHCQ), Licensing and Certification (L&C) Program to health facilities that are licensed or certified by L&C. The information contained in the AFL may include changes in requirements in healthcare, enforcement, new technologies, scope of practice, or general information that affects the health facility.
- Healthcare-Associated Infections (HAI) Program** - CDPH health communications sent through the system by the HAI program.
- Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)** - National Health Alert Network (HAN) is CDC's primary method of sharing cleared information about urgent public health incidents with public information officers; federal, state, territorial, tribal, and local public health practitioners; clinicians; and public health laboratories.
- Policy Alerts** - CDPH Policy Alerts include the latest guidance and policy updates from CDPH. These may include updates to the California state public health officer orders, public health mandates, and other topics and resources. 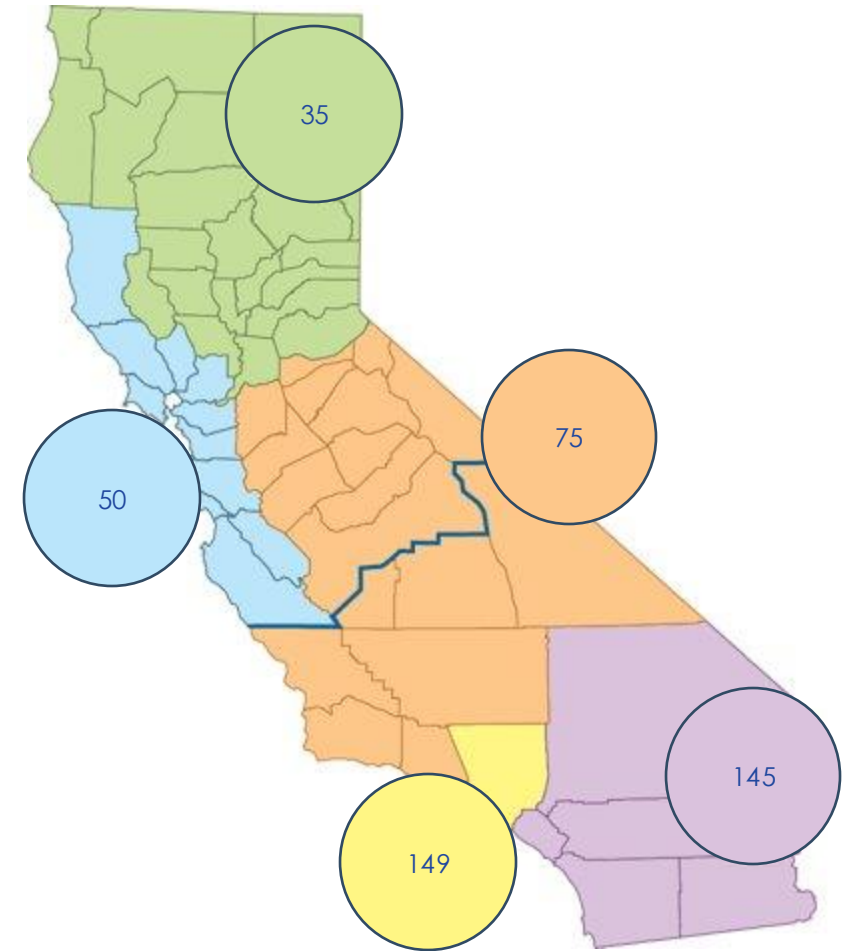
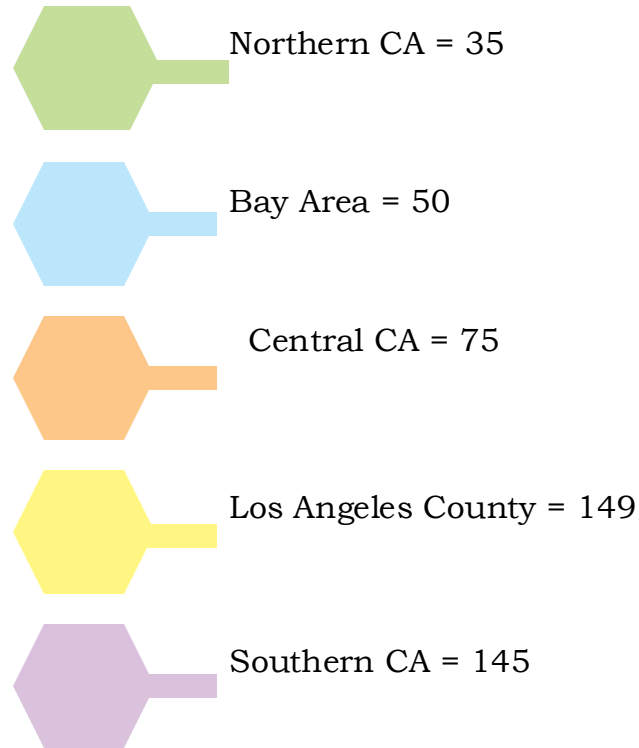

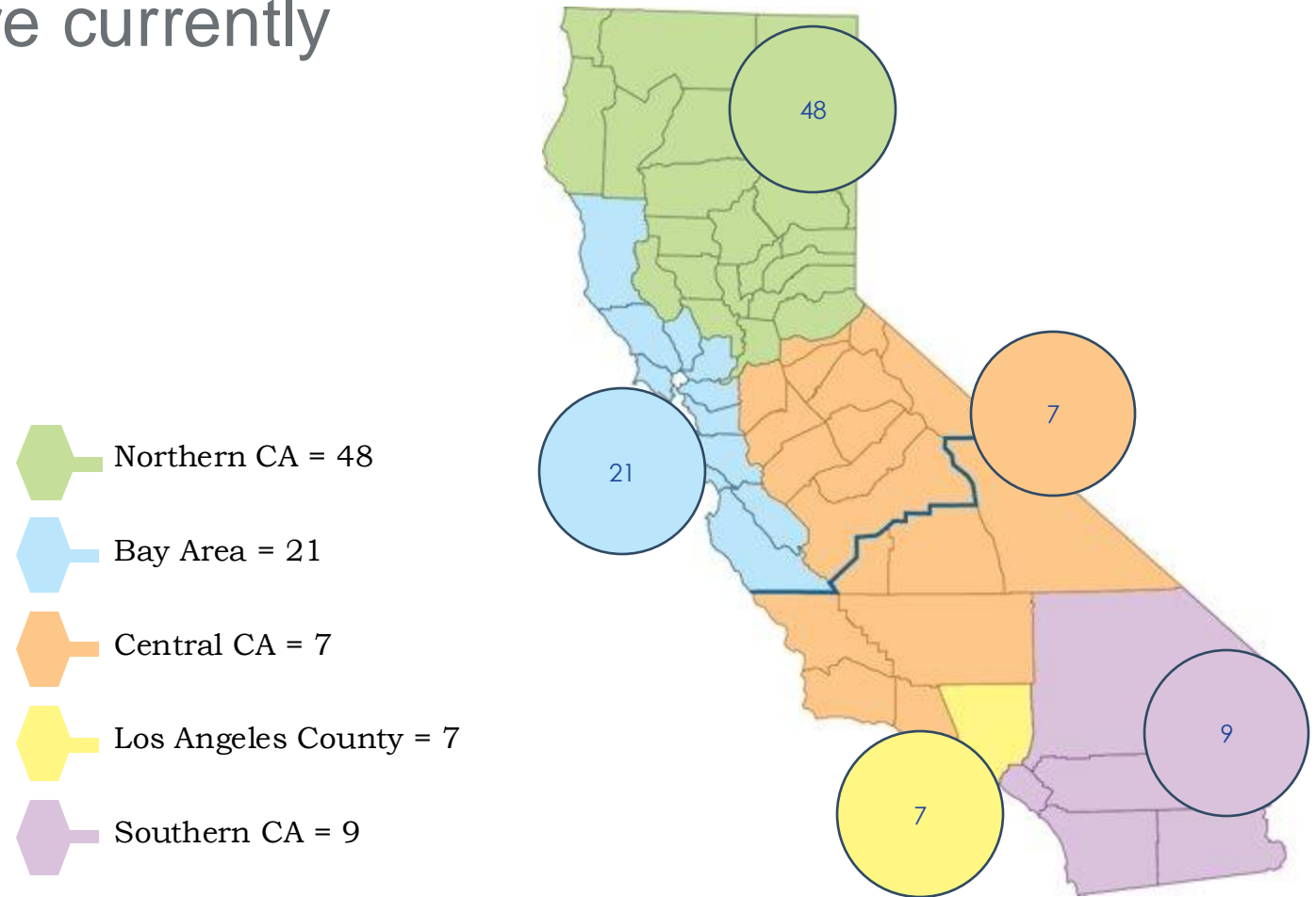

CAIR User Training: 1/1/25 – 3/31/25



LCRs / CAIR Trainer conduct 3 – 4 Interactive User Regular/Inventory trainings per day via Zoom (60 – 65 trainings per month)

In the first quarter of 2025, LCRs/Trainer staff conducted:

- 136 Regular trainings for 1462 users
- 10 Inventory trainings for 65 users

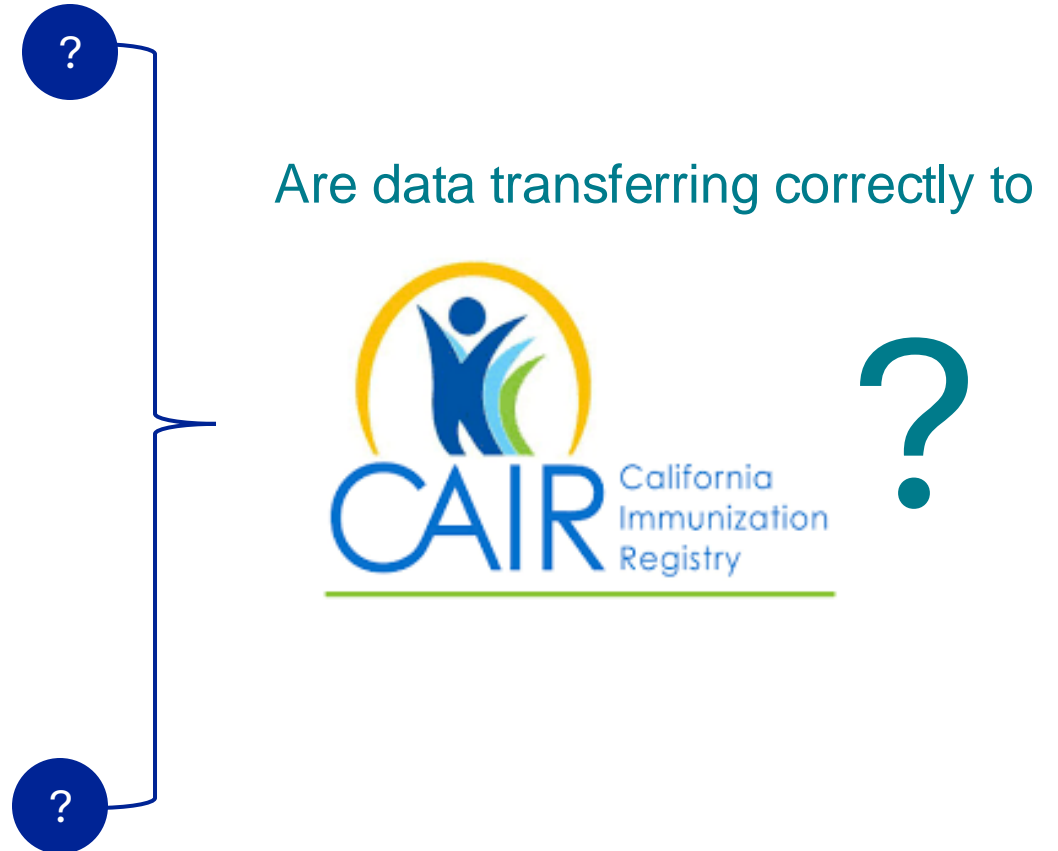

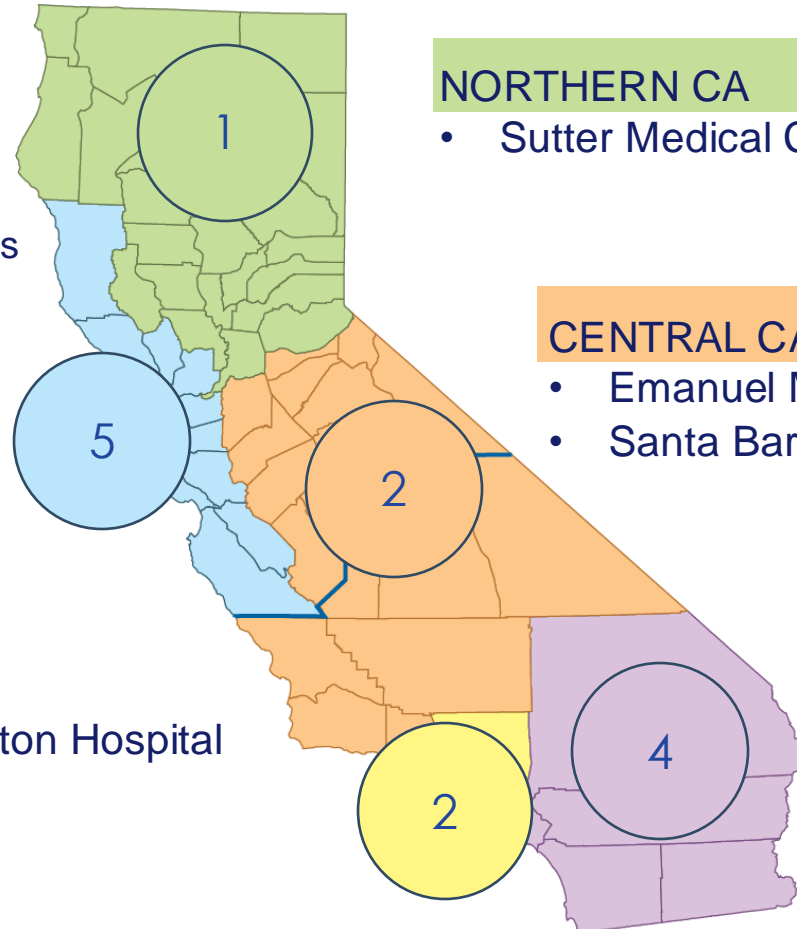

ACIP Votes: RSV and Meningococcal

- **RSV Vaccine – Adult:** ACIP recommends adults 50–59 years of age who are at increased risk of severe RSV disease receive a single dose of RSV vaccine.
- **Meningococcal Vaccine:**
 - ACIP recommends GSK's MenABCWY vaccine may be used when both MenACWY and MenB are indicated at the same visit*
 - ACIP recommends the Meningococcal Vaccines VFC resolution be updated to include the recommendation for use of GSK's MenABCWY vaccine when both MenACWY and MenB are indicated at the same visit

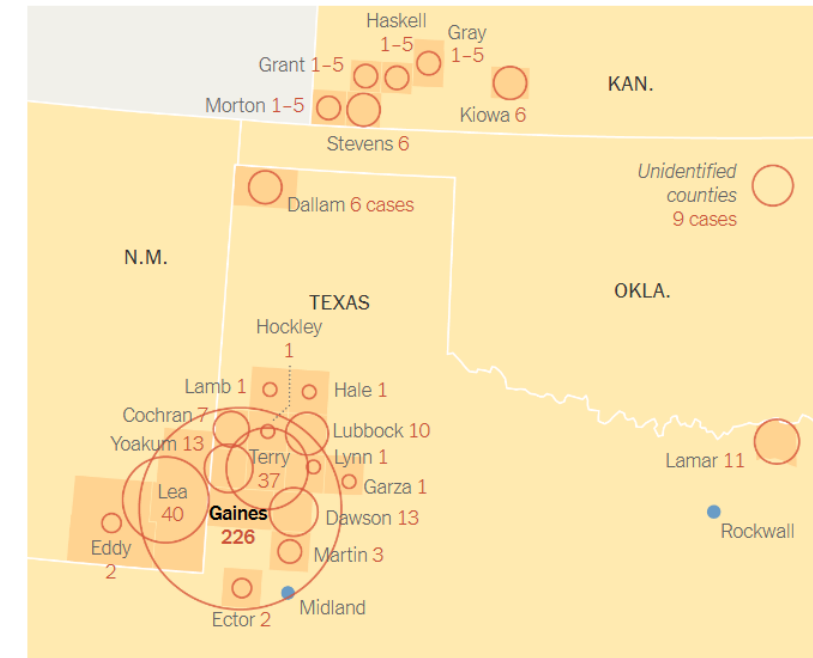
ACIP Votes: Chikungunya Vaccines

- **Vote 1:** ACIP recommends the virus-like particle chikungunya vaccine for persons traveling to a country or territory where there is a chikungunya outbreak.
- **Vote 2:** ACIP recommends the virus-like particle chikungunya vaccine for laboratory workers with potential for exposure to chikungunya virus.
- **Vote 3:** ACIP recommends the live attenuated chikungunya vaccine for persons traveling to a country or territory where there is a chikungunya outbreak.

Measles: Texas & New Mexico Outbreak, as of 4/15/2025

- TX: **561 cases**, 58 (10%) hospitalized, 2 (0.4%) deaths
 - Fatality: 2 previously healthy, unvaccinated children
 - ~70% of cases younger than age 18 years
 - >30% younger than age 5 years
 - 98% of cases unvaccinated or unknown status
 - Few (2%) with at least one dose of MMR
- NM: **63 cases**, adjacent to affected TX counties
 - 1 death – unvaccinated adult
- OK: **9 confirmed, 3 probable cases** linked to TX/NM cases
- KS: 32 cases: same genotype, exposure links unclear
- OH: 10 cases, all unvaccinated, linked to international travel

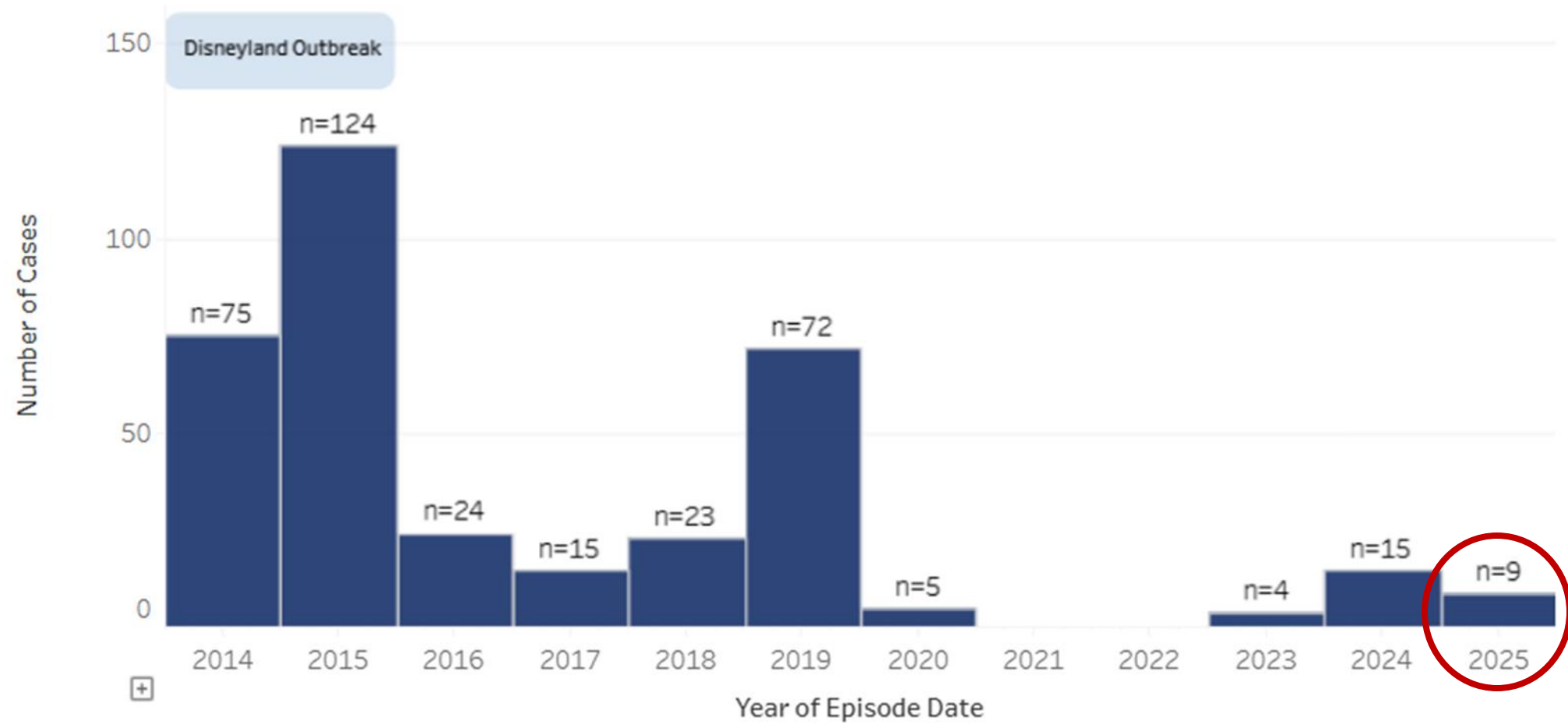

Measles in California, 2025 YTD: 9 Cases Reported

- 8 had history of international travel
 - Most had history of travel to Asian countries with measles outbreaks
 - 1 is a close contact to such a case
- All **unrelated** to the ongoing outbreak in Western Texas/New Mexico
- Counties: Fresno, Los Angeles, Orange, Placer, Riverside, San Mateo, Tuolumne
- Vaccination Status:
 - Unvaccinated or Unknown: **8** (89%)
 - One dose: **0** (0%)
 - Two doses: **1** (11%)

MMR Vaccine

- Best method of protection against measles, mumps and rubella
- Part of the routinely recommended US immunization schedule
- One dose has a 93% efficacy against measles
- Two doses have a 97% efficacy against measles
- Rare infections occur in immunized persons, especially in outbreaks.
- Vaccination remains the best way to protect against measles and reduce the risk of severe illness and complications.

Routine MMR Vaccine Recommendations

- Children: 2 doses
 - Dose 1: 12-15 months of age
 - Dose 2: 4-6 years of age
- Catch up: 1st dose now, 2nd dose in 28 days
- Adults
 - 1 dose or other evidence of immunity* if normal risk
 - 2 doses at least 28 days apart if high risk, e.g., post-secondary students, healthcare workers, **international travelers**

*Evidence of immunity:

- Written documentation of adequate vaccination,
- Laboratory evidence of immunity,
- Laboratory confirmation of measles, or
- Born in U.S. before 1957

International travel MMR vaccination guidance

Before international travel:

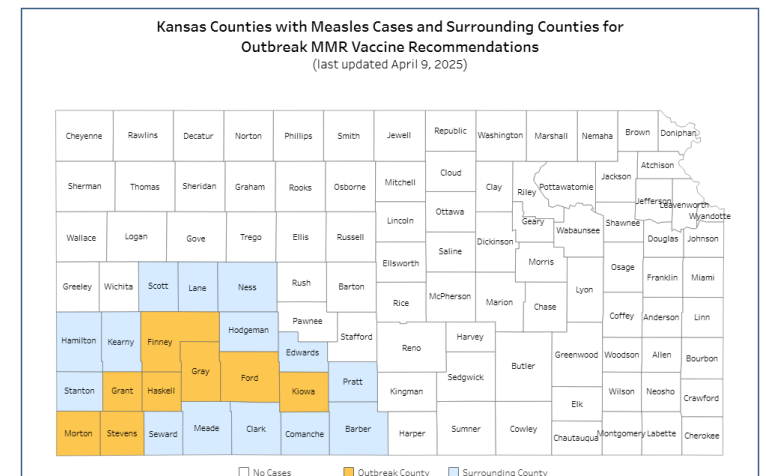
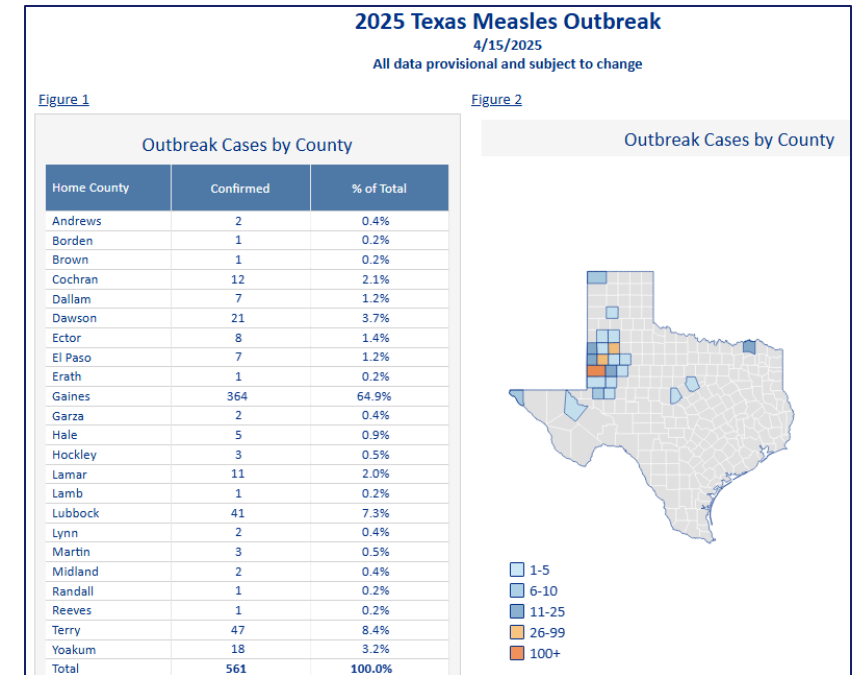
- All ages: up to date measles vaccination
- Ages 6-11 months
 - 1 dose before departure, then routine 2-dose series
- Age 12 months and older
 - First dose now → 2nd dose in 28 days

Domestic outbreak area MMR vaccination guidance

For people who **live in** or **visit** domestic outbreak areas, the additional 6 – 11 months of age dose or more rapid (28-day) interval between dose 1 and dose 2 may be recommended:

2025 VFC Recertification



- Recertification was due February 14, 2025
- 3,218 have completed recertification (98% of active providers)
- **71** providers have NOT completed Recertification
 - These accounts are currently suspended and cannot submit a VFC vaccine order nor transfer-in vaccines.
 - Several suspension warnings and notices have already been sent.

Recertification Overdue – Account Termination

- After several reminder and warning communications, providers who still have not recertified will be terminated from the VFC Program
 - Termination from the VFC Program may affect a provider's status with Medi-Cal.
- Account termination date: **Wednesday, April 30, 2025**
 - Several termination warning communications will be sent this month prior to account inactivation.
 - Targeted e-mail sent on Thursday, April 10, 2025
 - Automated myCAvax communication sent on Tuesday, April 15, 2025, and another to be sent 3 days prior to the termination date

McKesson Shipments and New Temperature Monitors

- New temperature monitors (TagAlert) are now being used in shipments from McKesson.
 - The TagAlert monitors for both warm and cold excursions during transit.
- Each shipment includes a [flyer with unpacking steps, TagAlert instructions, and cooler return instructions](#) to assist staff responsible for receiving the vaccines.
- EcoFlex coolers **must** be returned so that they can be reused.
 - The return shipping label to return the cooler is located on the inside flap of the EcoFlex box.
- KoolTemp coolers do **not** need to be returned to McKesson and can be discarded.
- TagAlert temperature monitors do **not** need to be returned to McKesson and can be discarded.

Shipment Incidents vs. Excursion Events

- Shipment Incidents – issues that occur during shipments (not including transfers)
- Examples:
 - Damaged vaccine upon receipt
 - Shortage/overage of vaccines received
 - Wrong order received
 - Temperature monitor revealed out-of-range temperatures experienced during transit

- Excursion Events – issues that occur whenever vaccines are exposed to temperatures outside recommended ranges (not including shipments)
- Examples:
 - Warm temperatures in refrigerator/freezer due to power outage
 - Cold temperatures due to freezer mechanical failure
 - Cold/warm temperatures due to leaving the storage unit door open

Ordering myCAvax

All programs now order vaccines through myCAvax (California Vaccine Management System). SGF flu vaccines are also available through myCAvax (refer to your LHD for other SGF vaccines).

1. Fully insured children and adults are not eligible to receive 317 vaccine routinely (adults enrolled in Medi-Cal/Medi-Cal managed care plans are considered fully insured). 317 vaccine may not be used in travel clinic settings.
2. Depending on funding, State General Fund vaccines may vary.
3. Starting January 2025, adults with Medicare Part B (without Part D) are eligible for Hepatitis B regardless of risk. 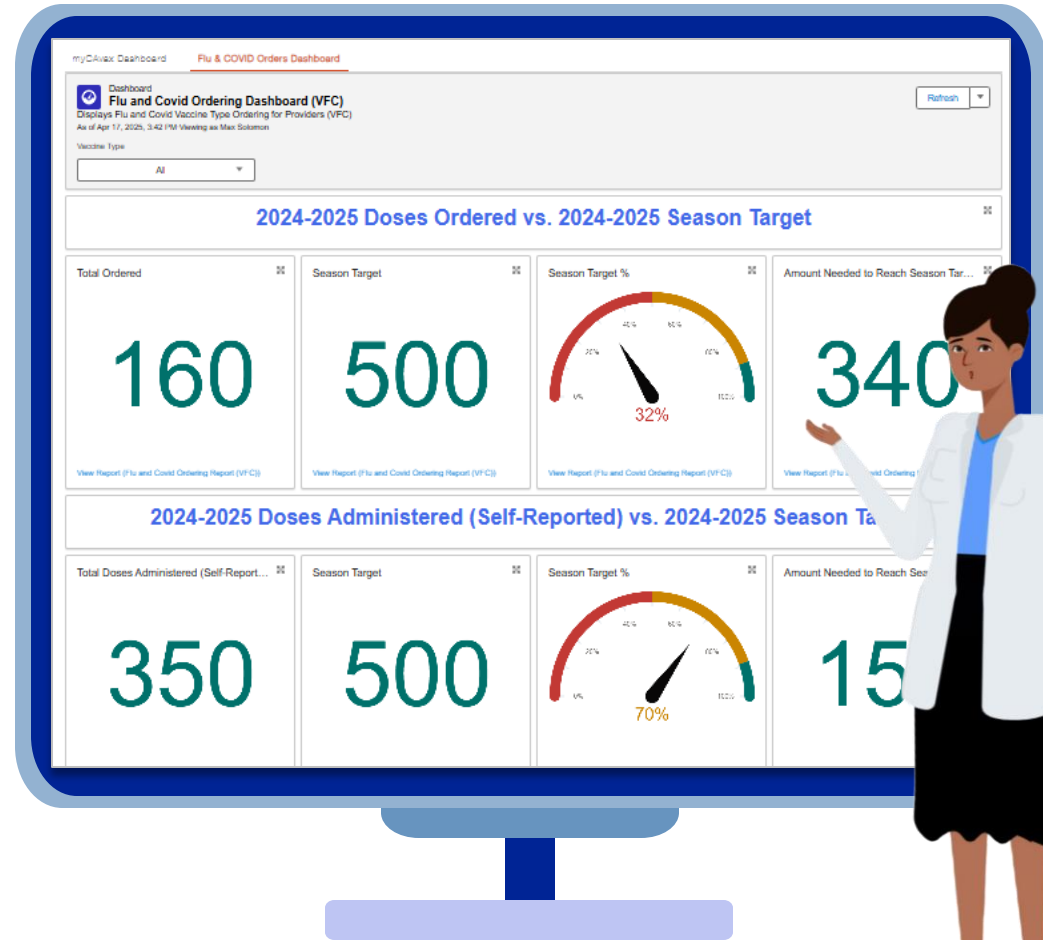
