

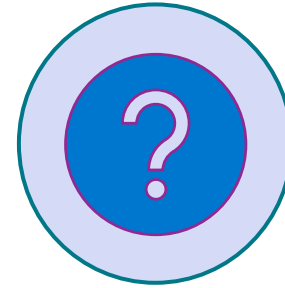

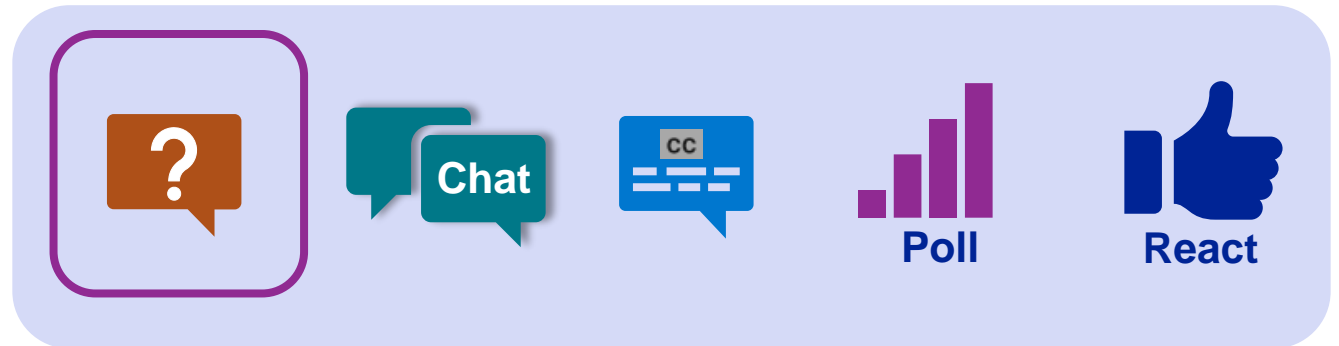

## Protect Yourself From Bird Flu When Working With Infected Dairy Cows

Bird flu can spread from animals to people and make you sick.

- The virus can be in raw milk, animal fluids or on surfaces.
- It can spread through splashes, dusts or droplets in the air. These can get in the eyes, nose, mouth and lungs.
- It can also spread if you touch infected surfaces and then touch your face.

**Protect your eyes, nose and mouth.**  
**Wear personal protective equipment (PPE) when doing high-risk jobs such as:**

- Milking cows, handling raw milk or cleaning the milking parlor.
- Caring for sick cows or cleaning their pens.
- Handling dead cows or cleaning their pens.



**Wear Goggles** (indirectly vented goggles) or a **face shield** to protect from splashes. Goggles are more protective than a face shield. Face shields keep masks dry.



**Wear an N95 respirator** or better to protect from virus in the air.



**Wear gloves** and don't touch your face.



**Wash or clean hands** often while working. Before going home, wash hands and face.

All PPE should be provided by your employer free of charge.  
If you have flu-like symptoms including eye redness or discharge, reach out to your local health department.

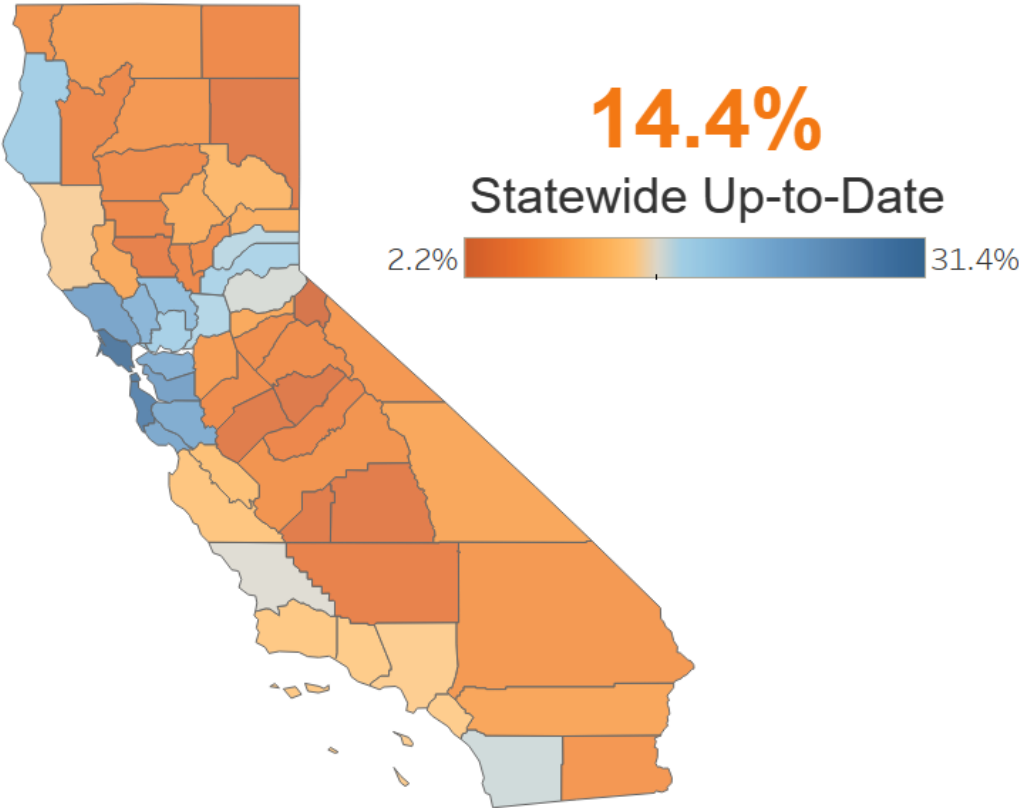
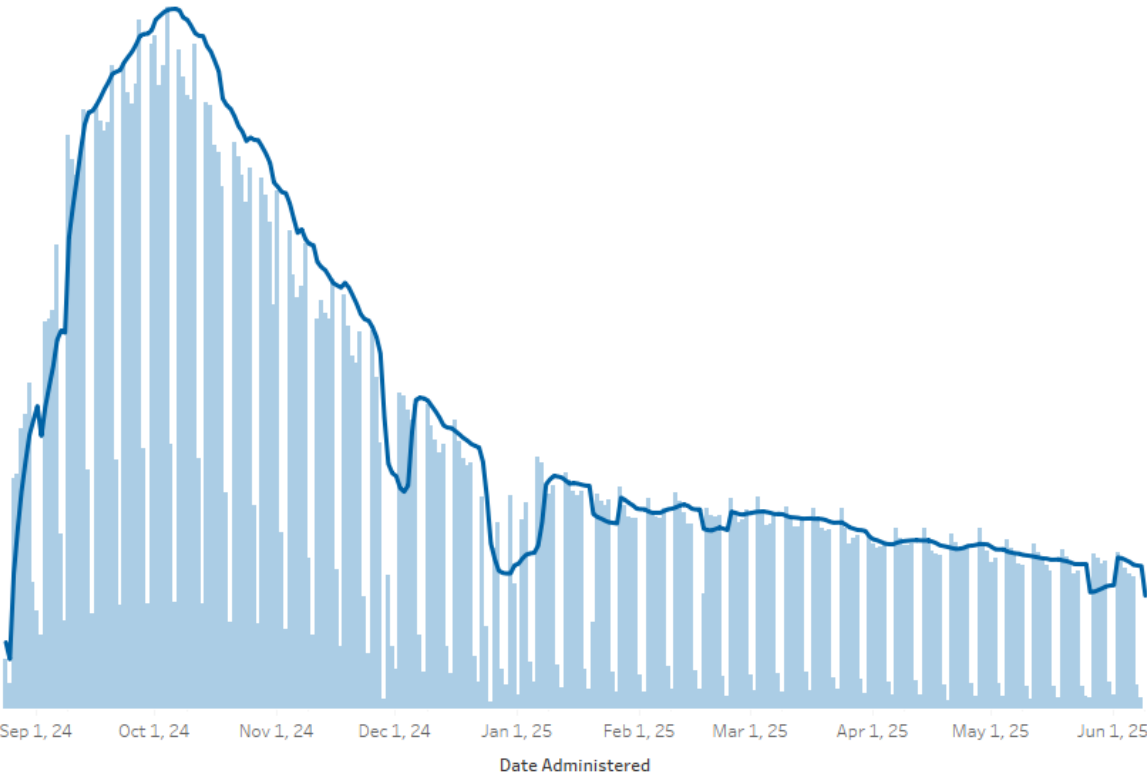

COVID-19 2024-2025 Vaccine by Daily Doses Administered: **Statewide**

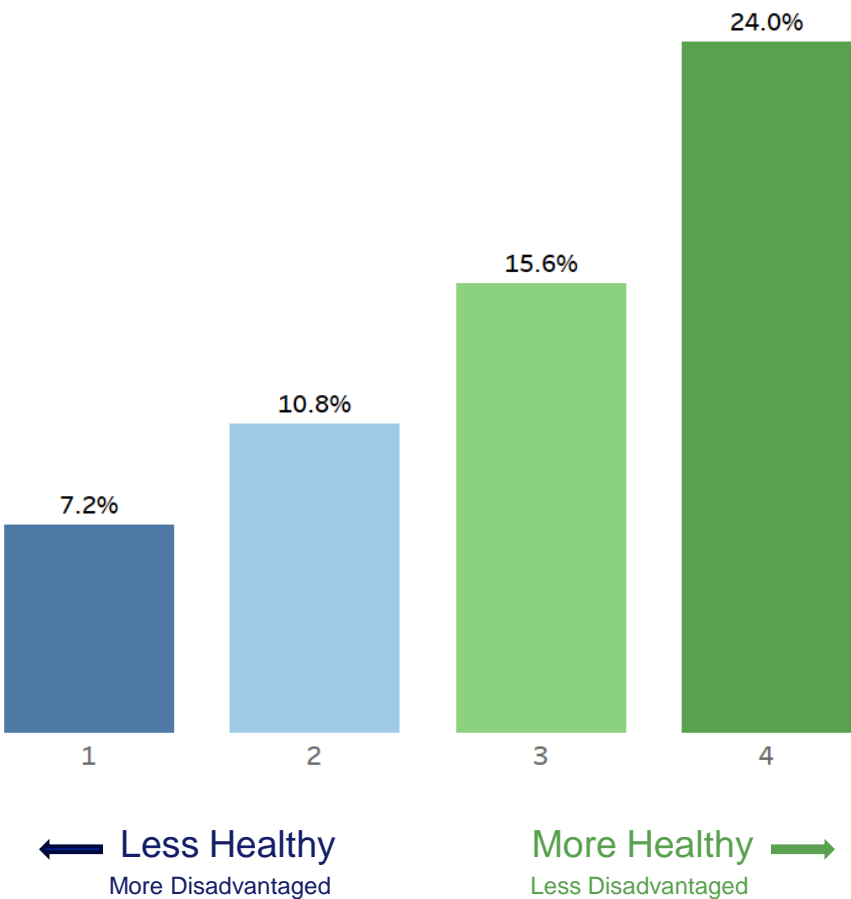

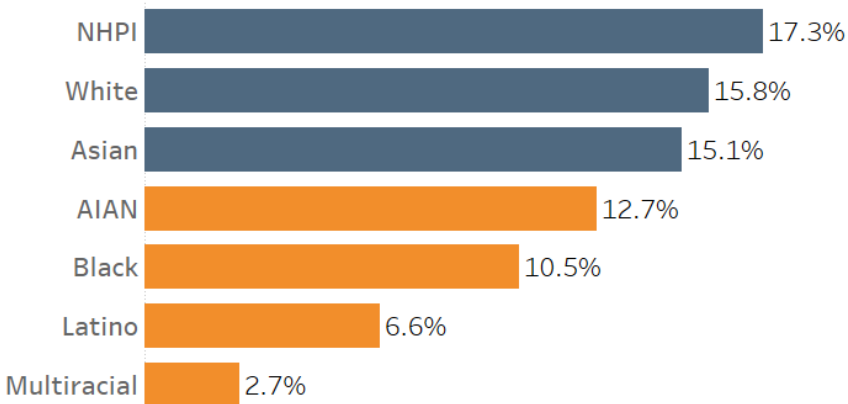

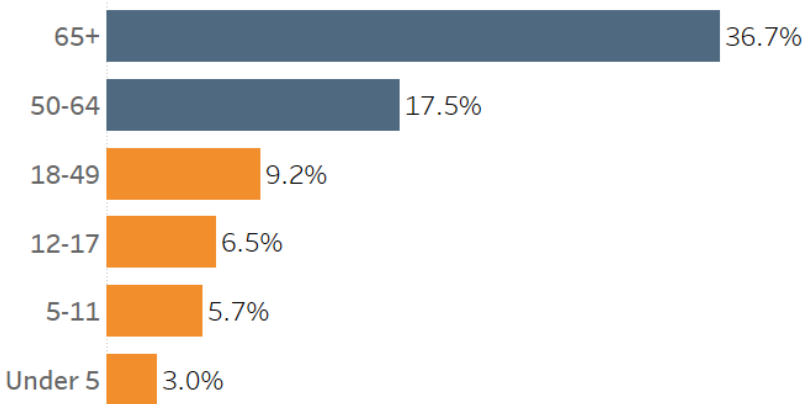
By HPI Quartile



By Race/Ethnicity



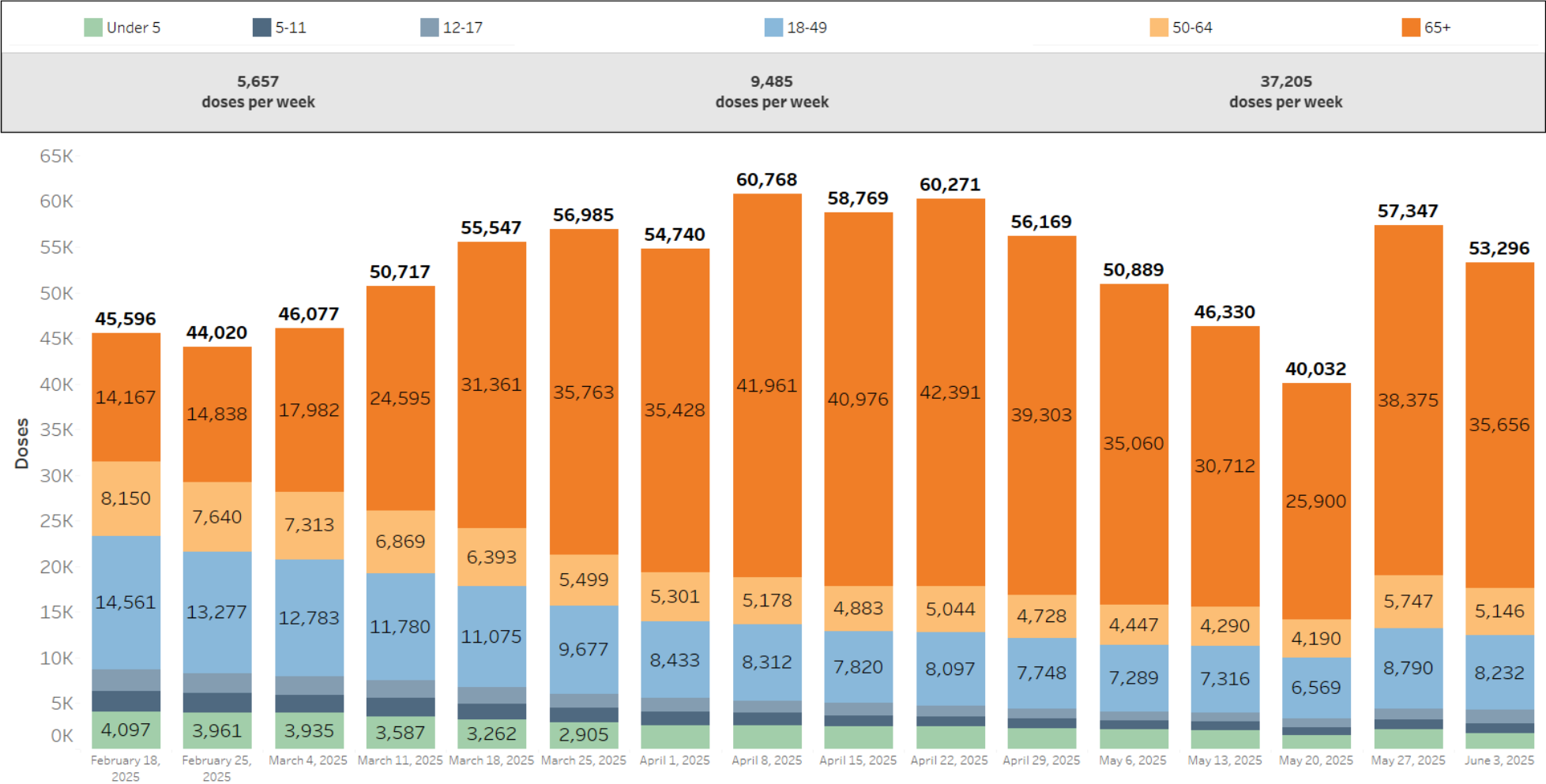
By Age Group

Doses Administered by Age Group, Past 16 Weeks

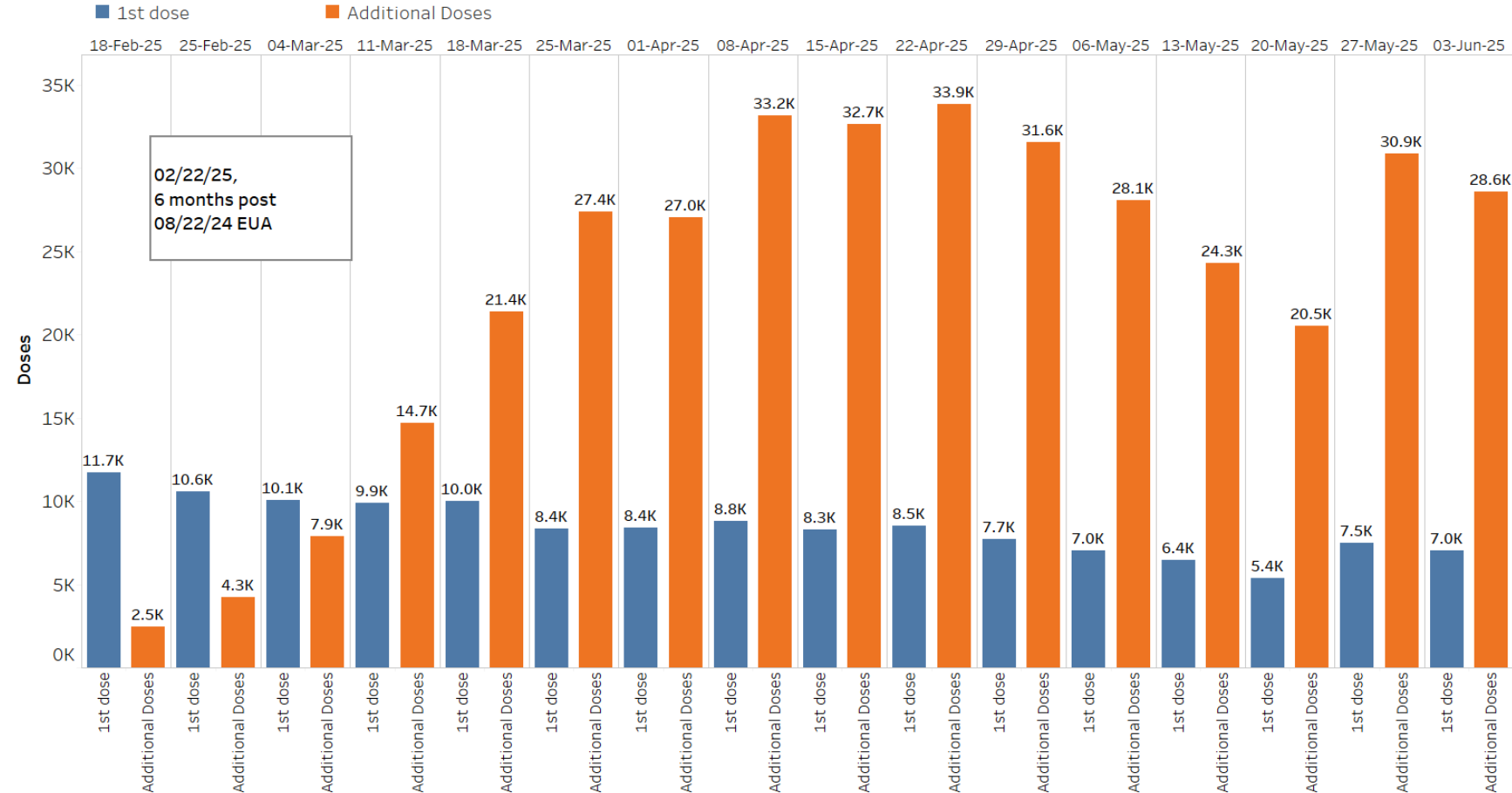


# 65+ COVID-19 Vaccine Administration

65+ Population COVID-19 Vaccine Administration by First vs Additional Doses





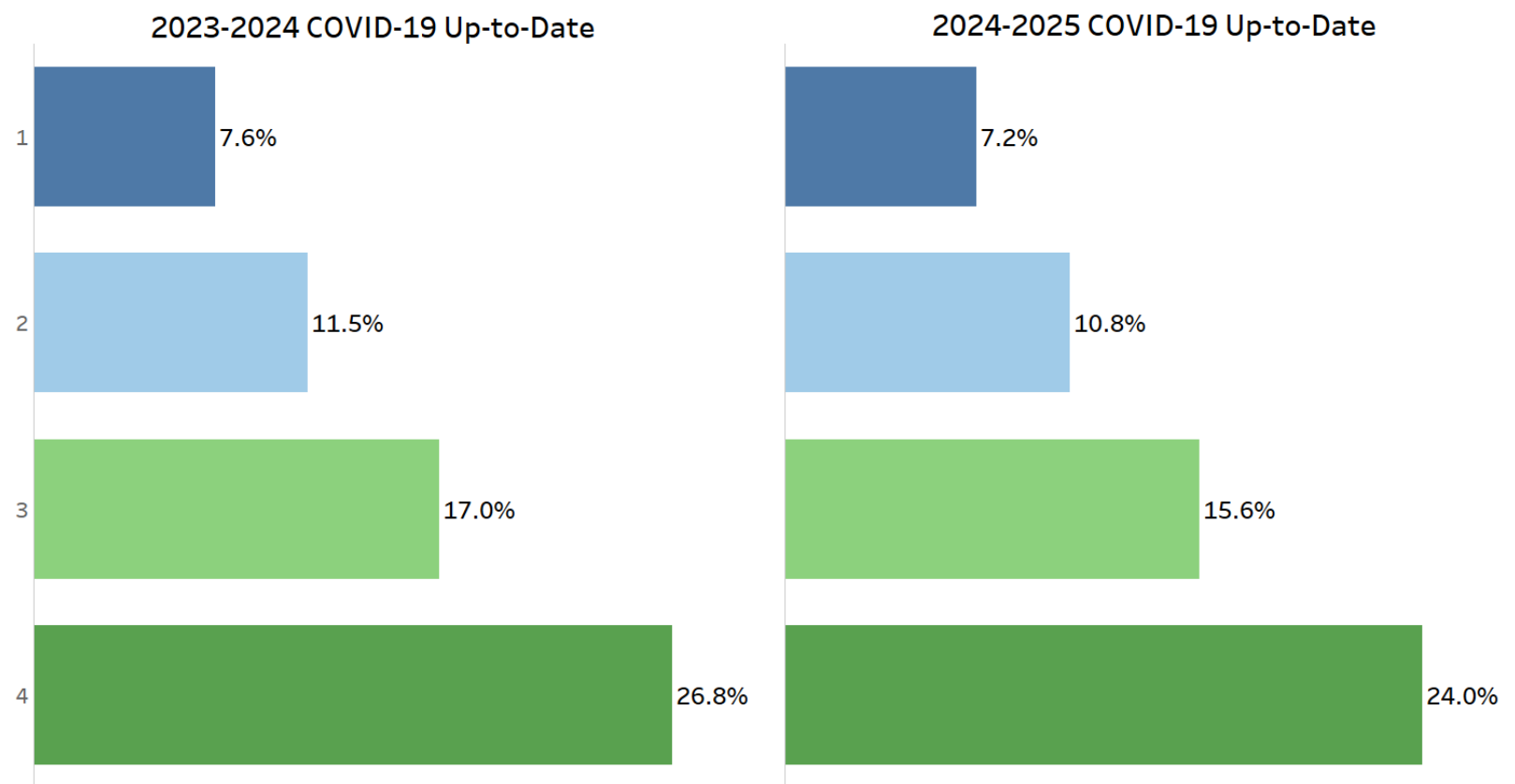
# COVID-19 Vaccine Uptake Comparison

# 2024 – 2025 VFC Flu Vaccine Orders

- Last day to order VFC flu vaccine for the 2024 – 2025 season was June 12, 2025.
- Most flu vaccine will expire on June 30, 2025.
- CDC will stop flu vaccine shipments 2 weeks prior to expiry.
- Ordering for flu vaccines will resume in the fall.

# 2025 – 2026 VFC Flu

## Pre-Book Providers:

- VFC is in the process of confirming approved pre-book amounts
  - Reviewing pre-books that were 200% or above their season target

## Non-Pre-Book Providers:

- VFC plans to allocate 50% of season target
  - More allocations can be requested after initial allocations have been distributed after flu season starts.
- If no season target, allocated 10 doses
- Non pre-book providers will be allocated doses based on available supply (likely either Fluzone or FluLaval).
  - If an organization had sites that did pre-book, we will try to match org preference (if obvious), including Fluarix and Flucelvax.
    - However, VFC will be tracking the amount left to allocate to make sure there will be enough doses for the providers who did pre-book available products

# Anticipated Flu Order Changes

- Working on a way we can proactively ship out pre-booked flu doses once supply is available, similar to what was done in myVFCVaccines
- Would likely ship out 50% of their approved pre-book as part of initial orders,
  - 50% would be shipped in increments as supply is received at McKesson, **NOT** all at once unless 100 doses or less.
- Providers who did not pre-book will be expected to submit their flu order through myCAvax and initial orders will **not** be automatically shipped.

# Preparing for FluMist this Fall

- Until now, FluMist could only be administered by healthcare providers. However, starting this 2025 – 2026 Flu season, “FluMist at Home” will allow patients to either administer to themselves and family members without a trip to their healthcare provider or pharmacy.
- AstraZeneca partnered with ASPN, an online pharmacy, to provide access to this product, and ship directly to the patient’s home.
- Upon delivery, ASPN will send automated text messages with reminders to administer the vaccine and confirm receipt of the vaccine. Then, ASPN will report administration to the state’s IIS.
- **Note that FluMist at Home will NOT be offered through the VFC Program this fall.**

# 2025 – 2026 RSV Planning

- CDC plans to open ordering for RSV in August to allow more time for planning, preparation, and building inventory.
  - ACIP recommends immunization with RSV monoclonal antibody between October and March.
- CDC recommends that we open provider ordering the month before immunization is planned to begin (September).
- Another RSV monoclonal antibody has been licensed (Merck's Clesrovimab product). More information about VFC availability will be forthcoming.
- Ordering controls will be implemented (bi-weekly thresholds) and will be based on CA's ordering history of other vaccines.
- CDC will let us know our projected threshold levels in late June/early July

# 2025-2026 RSV Pre- Book

- To prepare for the next Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) season, the VFC Program is planning on introducing a RSV Pre-Book for monoclonal antibodies available through VFC.
- The process will be similar to our VFC Flu Pre-Book process, but with several purposes:
  - Obtain individual provider demand ahead of time (by RSV product).
  - Know who should be prioritized for RSV doses once initial supply is made available (aside from known facilities serving infants).
  - Ability to streamline the shipment of RSV doses if we know ahead of time individual provider demand
- More information about RSV Pre-Book (including products that may be available through VFC) will be communicated when ready.
- In the meantime, discuss with your clinic leadership about the number of RSV immunizations you anticipate needing for the next season.



# Vaccine Deliveries in June / July

Due to federal holidays in mid-June and early July, as well as a planned CDC Vaccine Management System downtime, there may be a longer-than-normal delivery times for vaccine orders placed in late June/early July. As a result, for deliveries needed in early July, **CDC recommends placing orders prior to June 20, 2025.**

## Key dates:

- Thursday, June 19 – Juneteenth holiday. **No vaccine delivery.**
- Wednesday, June 25, from 6pm to Monday, June 30, at 5am
  - **No orders can be submitted to CDC during this timeframe.**
  - **Vaccine order submission, review and approval through myCAvax can still occur.**
- Friday, July 4 – Independence Day. **No vaccine delivery.**

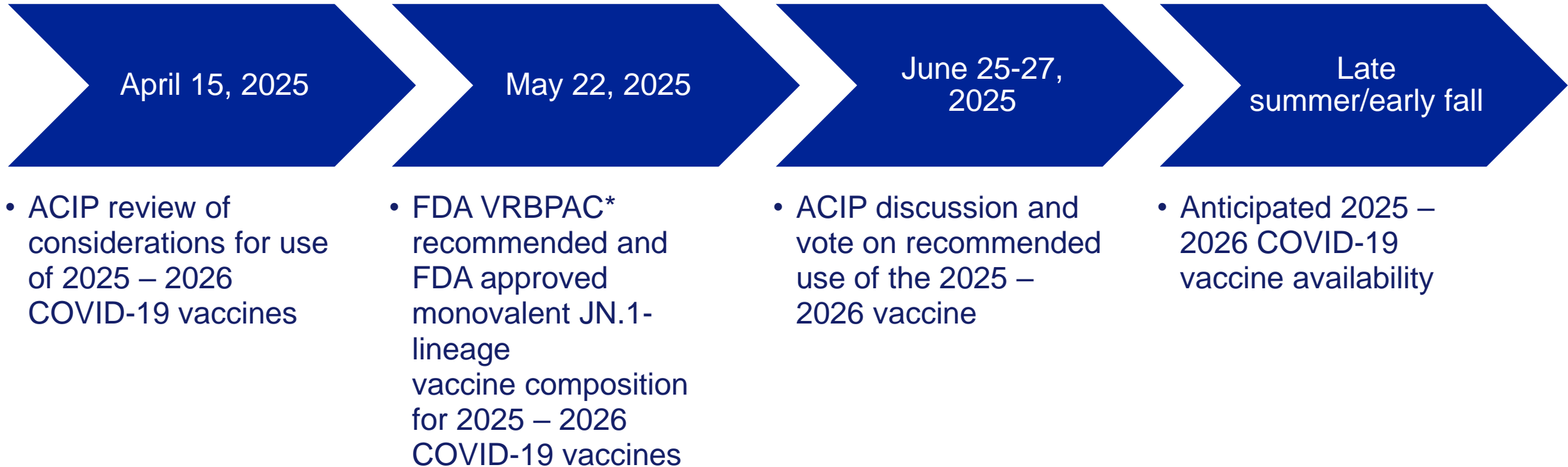

# CDPH Continues Efforts to Protect All Californians at Risk from COVID-19 Disease

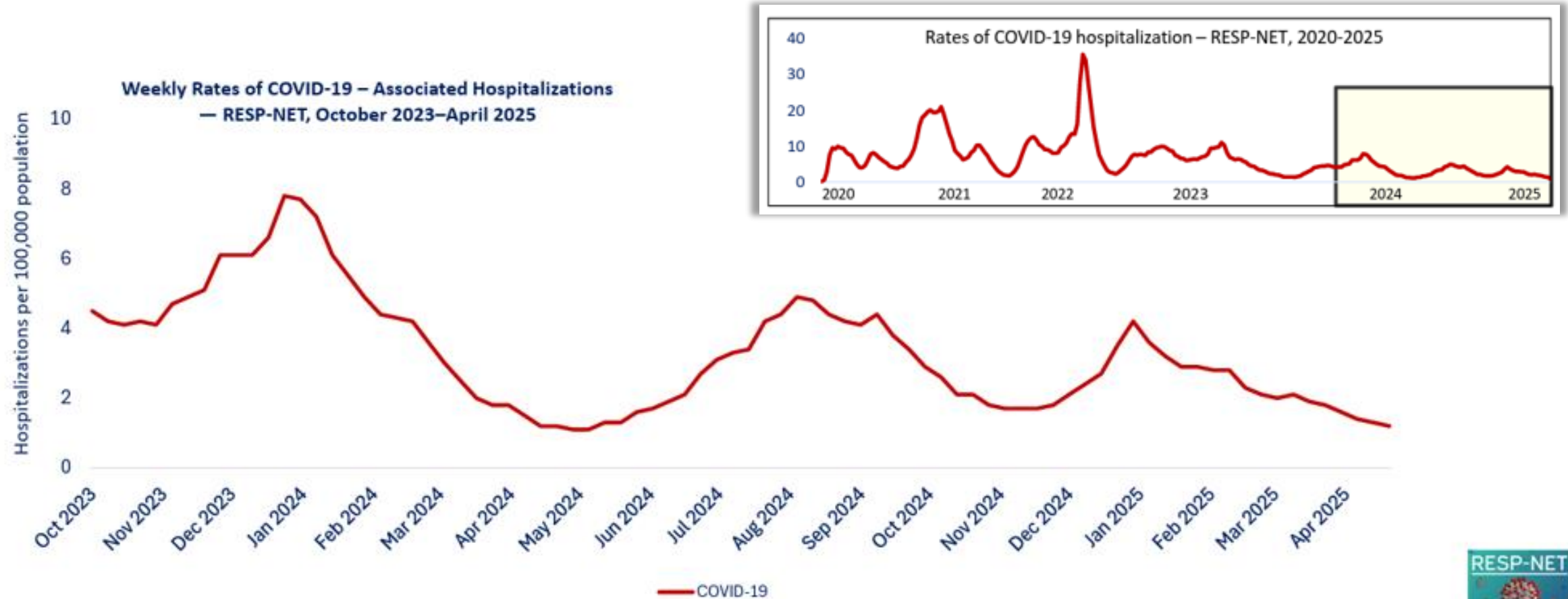
- COVID-19 continues to circulate in California and future seasonal increases are likely. Staying up to date with COVID-19 vaccination can reduce the risk of disease, especially more severe cases that result in hospitalization or death.
- **CDPH supports current recommendations that COVID-19 vaccines be available for all persons aged 6 months and older who wish to be vaccinated.** Californians should contact their health care provider for specific vaccination recommendations.

# COVID-19 Hospitalization Rates have had Both Winter and Summer Peaks



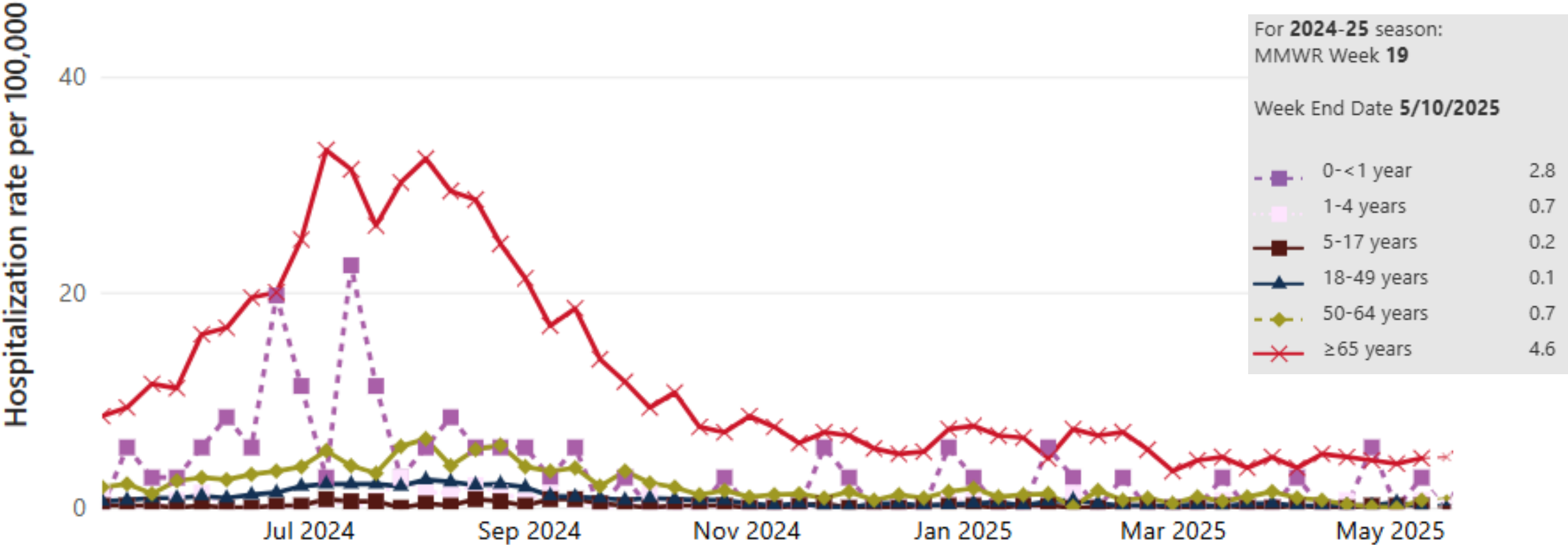

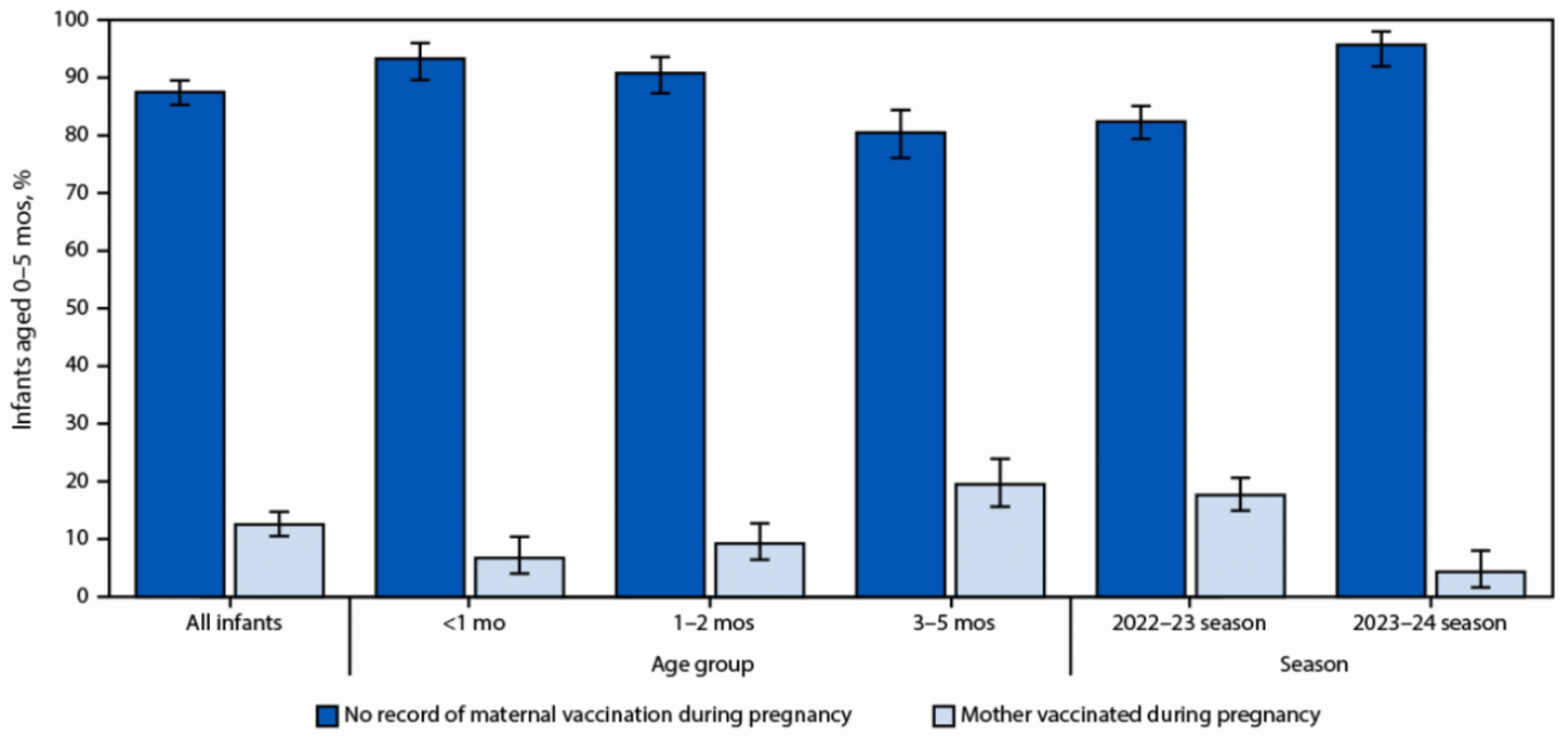
# Oldest and Youngest Age Groups Have the Highest COVID-19 Hospitalization Rates

# Recent Federal Policy Changes

- 5/20/25 New FDA leadership propose in the *New England Journal of Medicine* a revised regulatory framework for new COVID-19 vaccines
  - If Age 65+ years (all) or Age 6 months-64 years with [Risk Factors for Severe COVID-19](#), immunogenicity data (antibody titers) would be acceptable.
    - **Pregnancy and recent pregnancy are listed as risk factors.**
  - For Age < 65 Years without risk factors, additional randomized controlled trial (RCT) would be needed.
- 5/27/25 US DHHS Secretary posts on [social media that COVID vaccine recommendations would exclude healthy children and healthy pregnant women](#)
- 5/30/25 [CDC immunization schedules](#) are revised:
  - Children: [shared clinical decision-making](#) replaces previous routine recommendation
  - Pregnant persons: removed previous routine recommendation (but currently covered because all ages  $\geq 6$  months are currently recommended for immunization).

The recent announcement of intended changes to the recommended immunization schedule for children and pregnant persons circumvents the established process for vaccine review and recommendations and, if fully implemented, would be a dangerous setback. We protect public health by allowing trusted experts with backgrounds in science and medicine to review data and make recommendations for what vaccines should be included in the Vaccines for Children program and in recommendations for other groups – not by allowing non-clinicians to make unilateral decisions.

Vaccines play a crucial role in protecting vulnerable groups, especially children and pregnant patients and their caregivers, against disease. These changes would also undermine access, impact insurance coverage and impede progress made toward improving public health. We urge patients to talk with their family physician and make decisions based on trusted, evidence-based care.”

# COVID-19 Vaccine Summary

- Recent federal policy statements and changes have raised questions and confusion about recommendations and access to COVID-19 vaccines.
- COVID-19 vaccines continue to be important tools to prevent severe disease in vulnerable populations.
- **CDPH recommends that all individuals age 6 months and older should have access and the choice to receive currently authorized COVID-19 vaccines, with an emphasis on protecting higher risk individuals, such as infants and toddlers, pregnant individuals, and others with risks for serious disease.**
- Insurance coverage for COVID-19 vaccines is still in place.

# What's New in My Turn – Release 59

New updates for providers launched on Friday, **June 06, 2025!**

## My Turn Public

### Release Highlights

- ✓ Display the 'Shots for School' carousel module on the My Turn Landing page.
- ✓ Display an error message if the starting and ending date overlaps in the 'Starting Date' and 'Closing Date' fields, or if the times overlaps in the 'Open from' and 'Open to' fields in the 'Open Dates and Hours of Operations' section on the 'List a new location' page.
- ✓ Enable setting multiple start and end dates for testing sites in the 'List a location', 'Update a location' and 'Delete a location' forms.
- ✓ Enable setting multiple start and end dates the 'List a location', 'Update a location' and 'Delete a location' forms in the 'List a new location' page.
- ✓ Display error message if the starting/closing dates overlaps while adding hours of operation in the 'List a new location' and 'Update a location' form.

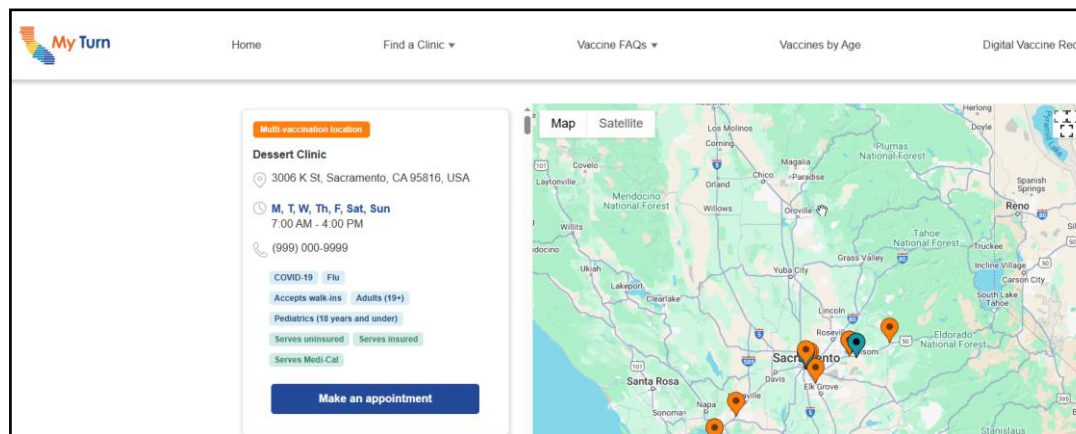

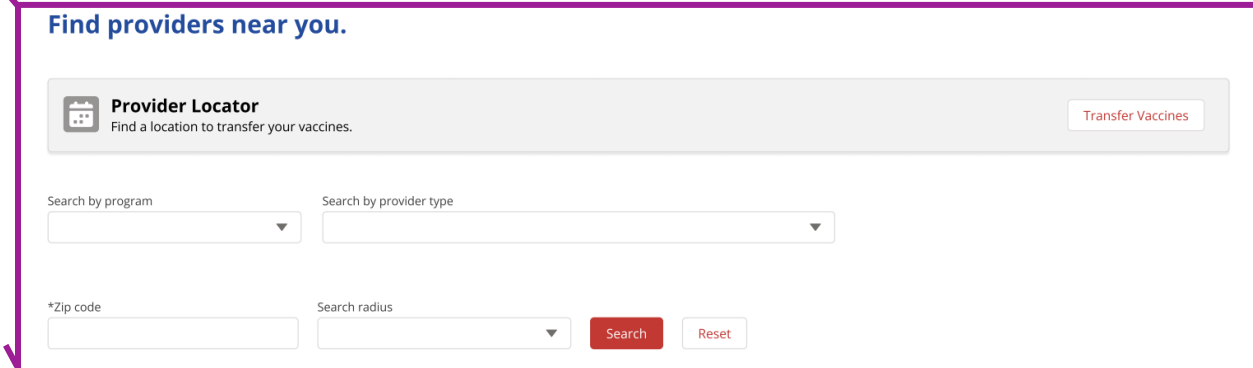
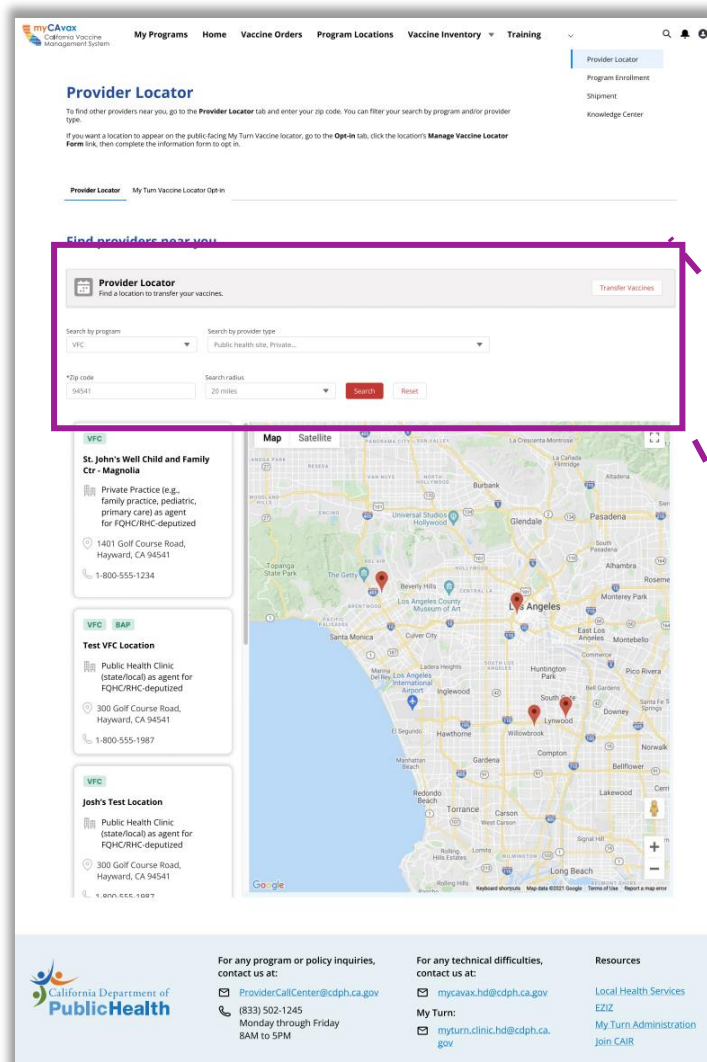

# Provider Locator – What is it?

The My Turn Vaccine Locator in myCAvax allows Providers the option to display their Vaccination Locations in the My Turn Public Portal.

- **Opted-In Providers are able to:**
  - Help patients locate nearby providers
  - Update their operating hours and the available vaccines
  - Opt-out at any time
- **What are the Benefits of Opting-In?**
  - Increases the accessibility of vaccines throughout California
  - Increased clinic visibility with the ability to market clinics on a state-wide platform
  - Increased accessibility to CDPH vaccination programs

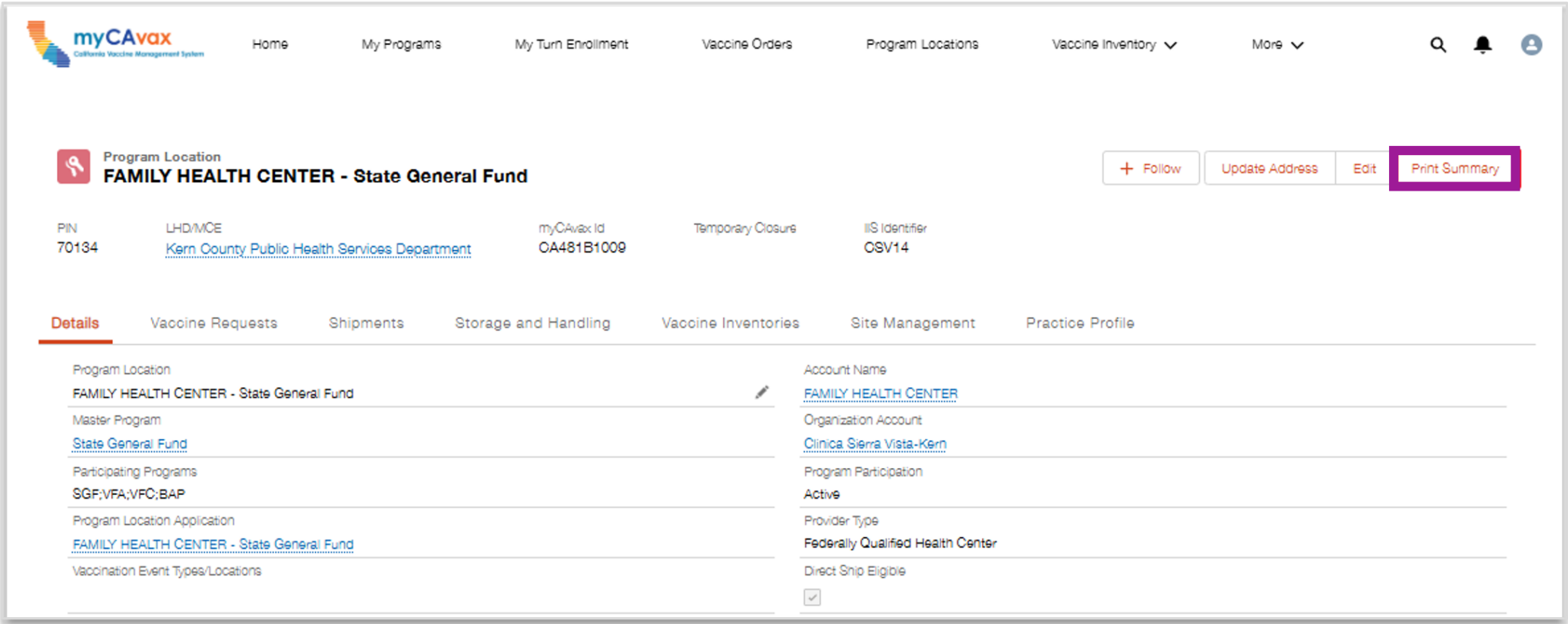

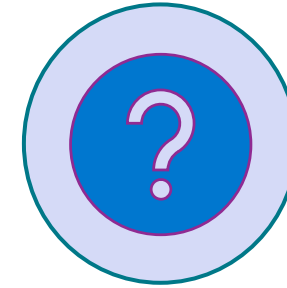
