





A: Yes. A courier service is available to transport vaccine between COVID-19 vaccine Providers using the myCAvax Vaccine Marketplace. To request a Vaccine Marketplace courier, Providers can contact the COVID-19 Provider Call Center via email at covidcallcenter@cdph.ca.gov, or by phone at 833.502.1245. For details on the Vaccine Marketplace, please visit Vaccine Marketplace Job Aid.



A: Yes. The CDC recommends COVID-19 Providers administer the vaccine to all eligible patients at vaccination sites, even if this requires puncturing a new vial without administering all doses. Providers should minimize waste, when possible, and continue to report any waste. Please see Missed Vaccine Opportunities & Wastage and Identification, Disposal, and Reporting of COVID-19 Vaccine for complete guidance.



A: Eligible COVID-19 vaccine Providers, in participating Local Health Jurisdictions, can order smaller quantities of vaccine in myCAvax. The "Small Order" option will appear on the myCAvax Order Request Form for Providers who are designated to receive smaller shipments by their Local Health Jurisdictions. Please note: Providers should only submit small order requests when a standard order cannot be accommodated, or when vaccine doses cannot be found on the Vaccine Marketplace. - 79.42% of 65+ population has received at least one dose and 69.45% is fully protected.









Mission Statement



The CalVaxGrant is committed to increasing providers vaccinating against the COVID-19 pandemic by supporting and incentivizing small physician organizations to increase and maintain their participation in the myCAvax program and administer COVID-19 vaccines.



Overview and Funding



- The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) appropriated \$40 million to the CalVaxGrant physician practice support program.
- CalVaxGrant is anticipating awarding approximately 3,000-4,000 practices with the funds.
- CDPH has contracted with Physicians for a Healthy California (PHC) to administer the program.



Eligibility Requirements



- Completed and approved section A and B of the myCAvax application process
- Be a physician medical practice, community clinic or FQHC
- Have 200 physicians or less within the organization
- Will expend or plan to expend \$10,000 per site for up to 5 sites between
 November 1, 2020 and November 1, 2021
- Have not received pandemic grant funds to support COVID-19 vaccine administration such as the State Innovation Fund



Practice Support Grant Requirements



- Have expended or will expend the grant funds on allowable expenses such as:
 - Staffing
 - Training
 - Technology
 - Infrastructure
 - Supplies and Equipment
 - Administrative Overhead
- Order COVID-19 vaccines through myCAvax
- Respond to all PHC and CDPH requests in a timely manner and follow all conditions within the Awardee Agreement





CDPH Equity Index and Priority Areas

- An additional \$1,000 will be given to administering vaccination locations matching CDPH's identified equity zip codes for up to five (5) locations.
- Eligible zip codes are identified through CDPH's VEM Quartile system and match either Quartile 1 or 2 for identifying them as the least healthy communities' condition.
- CDPH assigned quartiles to zip codes for the purposes of COVID-19 vaccine allocation and reporting only

"You Call the Shot California" Gift Cards Update

The You Call The Shot California program offers \$50 incentive cards to all Californians starting their COVID-19 vaccination series on or after **May 27**th. The eligibility to be entered will **end July 18**th.

Eligibility

- Californians who began their COVID-19
 vaccination between 5/27 and 7/18, provided
 they complete their vaccination.
- This program applies to all vaccination sites in California that use their electronic health records or any site using My Turn proper, including in-home vaccinations. All providers administering COVID-19 vaccines already report administered doses into IIS/CAIR.

Small Order Functionality

The Small Order Functionality allows providers who do not have the need or capacity to store vaccines in the standard lot size, to place a vaccine order in smaller quantities. Eligible providers can select "Small Order" when submitting an order request.

LHD Key Responsibilities:

- Maintain on hand inventory to fill small orders
- Review and approve orders placed by providers within their jurisdiction
- Determine minimum dose quantity, delivery preference, and eligible providers
- Coordinate with providers on fulfillment of orders based on LHD delivery preference
- Download fulfillment file, complete required information, and upload file to complete the order in myCAvax

Provider Key Responsibilities:

- Submit small order requests in a timely manner
- Submit small order requests only when a standard order cannot be accommodated, or doses cannot be found on marketplace
- Coordinate with LHDs on fulfillment of orders based on LHD delivery preference
- Report waste, excursion, and shipping incidents that may occur



myCAvax Vaccine Program, Allocation, and TPA Process & System Improvements

In response to the myCAvax survey feedback, the **Vaccine Program, Allocation, and TPA Process & System Teams** have implemented the following measures to improve their level of service:

Improvements

- Vaccine is available to approved providers through the Order Request Form in myCAvax; small order capability added
- Streamlined enrollment processing provides most approvals to less than 1 week
- Job aids and COVID Call Center better equipped to provide enrollment support

System

- Provider reporting functionality added to myCAvax
- Review system capability for single sign-on
- Working towards a 3-week release cycle, updates to align, simplify, and support processes




COVID-19 Vaccine New Guidance for Schools

Naomi Bardach, MD, California Health & Human Services









Framework and Rationale for CDC and CDPH guidance

- SARS-CoV-2 causes damage directly and indirectly
 - Infections, hospitalizations, death, long COVID
 - School closures, distance learning, loss of school days— Substantial educational losses, inequity, social and emotional consequences
- The goal of the K-12 Schools guidance is safe and successful schools
 - Full, in-person instruction for all students, with minimized school days lost, safely
- CDC and CDPH: layered approach to safety

CDPH Tools in the tool kit, Weapons in the arsenal

- <u>Vaccination</u> for all eligible individuals to get COVID-19 rates down throughout the community
- Universal masking in schools
 - Simple and highly effective, and which enables:
 - No minimum physical distancing, allowing all students access to full in-person learning, and
 - More targeted quarantine practices, keeping students in school
 - Prevents outbreaks, avoiding many days of missed instruction
- Contact tracing, isolation, quarantine, including <u>modified</u> <u>quarantine</u> to allow students to stay in school if mask on mask (in schools with universal masking policy)
- Access to a robust COVID-19 <u>testing</u> program as an available additional safety layer and to optimize school days

Additional considerations

- Current unknowns associated with more transmissible variants, including the Delta variant
- Operational barriers of tracking vaccination status, classroom and hallway monitoring
- Potential detrimental effects of differential mask policies based on vaccination status (high schools and middle schools, since all elementary school students not yet eligible)
- Will revisit mask guidance no later than November 1, 2021

Current pandemic metrics

Vaccine metrics

- Statewide fully vaccinated 12-17 year olds: 36%
- Fully vaccinated overall: 61% (9% partially)





Reproductive rate of the virus by county in CA








Additional Delta information

Vaccines to all staff, adults living with staff, adults living with students, and all students 12+. Other safety layers because some may not yet be vaccinated, and younger students not eligible.



FDA Update to Janssen COVID-19 Vaccine EUA

- Coronavirus (COVID-19) Update: July 13, 2021 (FDA)
- Update to <u>Janssen COVID-19 Vaccine FDA EUA factsheets</u>: Very low chance of developing Guillain-Barré syndrome after Janssen COVID-19 vaccine.
- For recipients and caregivers: Seek medical attention right away if you develop any of the symptoms:
 - Weakness or tingling sensations, especially in legs or arms, that worsens and spreads to other parts of the body
 - Difficulty walking
 - o Difficulty with facial movements, including speaking, chewing, or swallowing
 - Double vision or inability to move eyes
 - Difficulty with bladder control or bowel function
- Per unofficial CDC report, 100 preliminary reports out of 12.8 million doses administered.
- Data insufficient to determine causality, and benefits of vaccination continue to outweigh risks.

Pfizer 450 Shipper Update

- Due to large number of international shipments, Pfizer is running low on supply of thermal shipper inventory.
- Pfizer-450 orders of 2 or more to the same location may automatically be combined within the same shipper box.
 - Carton size will remain the same, but rather than receiving two separate shippers, there will be more cartons in the shipper when you receive it.
- Storage and handling of the shipper will remain the same.
- Providers are welcome to store the vaccine in the shipper if needed, but please return it as soon as possible to allow the shipper to be used for other shipments.



International Donations

- CDC recognizes that Providers and state/local governments have a desire to donate vaccine internationally
 - Complex legal issues involved
 - Questions about proper storage and handling
 - Potential safety concerns for vaccine donated internationally
- CDC working to assist U.S. government with transfer and distribution of vaccine to foreign governments directly from federal depots to assure that global distribution of vaccine is both efficient and safe.
- We need to continue finding homes for our unused COVID-19 vaccines with other Providers in the State.



Summer Storage & Handling

- Important to monitor vaccine temperature and ensure it does not become too warm.
- All three vaccine EUAs only recommend room-temperature storage at temperatures up to 77°F
 - Manufacturers have limited stability data for excursions at hotter temperatures.
 - Excursion at a higher temperature? Each of the COVID-19 vaccines have different stability information, therefore resulting viability of vaccine will depend on manufacturer.
- Continue storing vials and pre-drawn syringes in refrigerated transport container, monitored by a digital data logger, up until time of administration!


