Where can adults 19 years and older get COVID-19 vaccines?

Adults who:

- Have private health insurance
- Have Medi-Cal, Medicare Part B, or Medicare Part D

- Do not have health insurance
- Have private health insurance that does not cover the full cost of the vaccine (underinsured)



Your doctor should have vaccine available and it is your right to request it. You can also confirm with your insurance company about other options where COVID-19 vaccines are covered, such as your local pharmacy.

Most adults without insurance are eligible to receive COVID-19 vaccines at no cost through the **California Bridge Access Program (BAP)**.


If you have an insurance deductible that makes it harder to pay for vaccine, you are eligible to receive BAP doses. To find a BAP provider or pharmacy near you and make an appointment, go to: vaccines.gov

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Most adults with private insurance can receive COVID-19 vaccines at no cost.

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
