

My Turn flu functionality will be available in My Turn Clinic and My Turn Public by **September 29. Flu vaccine is not available for order in myCAvax** and must be obtained through the usual process. For more resources, visit <https://eziz.org/covid/myturn/flu/>.

### Pregnancy and flu Vaccine Context

According to [California Code, Health and Safety Code - HSC § 124172](#), pregnant women cannot receive the nasal spray, or the multidose vial vaccine.

[According to the CDC](#), getting a flu shot can reduce a pregnant person's risk of being hospitalized with flu by an average of 40 percent. Pregnant patients should get a flu shot that is **NOT the nasal spray or multidose vial vaccine**. Postpartum patients, even if they are breastfeeding, can receive any type of vaccine.

### My Turn Updates

**My Turn Clinic will be updated to include an additional pregnancy screening question** in the Vaccine Administrator flow by October 20. If a patient indicates that they are or might be pregnant, the system will **disable the option to administer the LAIV or nasal spray or multidose vial vaccines**. Vaccine administrators must **ONLY administer a single dose vial/prefilled syringe** in pregnant patients.

**Until the question is added to My Turn Clinic, Clinic Managers will need to internally train their staff** to ask patients if they are pregnant and possibly have signs around the clinic asking pregnant patients to let staff know.

It is very important for pregnant patients to get the flu vaccine as they are at increased risk for more severe flu disease. Since a question about pregnancy during appointment booking may be perceived as a screening question for contraindications, **My Turn Public will not be updated with the additional pregnancy question.**
