Q: What are the anticipated storage and handling guidelines for the Pfizer Infant/Toddler (6 months – 4 years) vaccine and the Moderna Infant/Toddler (6 months – 5 years) vaccine?

A: The following are anticipated storage and handling guidelines for the Pfizer Infant/Toddler (6 months – 4 years) vaccine:

- 10-dose multidose vial; 100 dose minimum order
- Can be stored at ultracold temperatures (-90C to -60C) until published expiration date
- Can be stored for 10 weeks at refrigerated temperatures; not to be stored at standard frozen temperatures (-50C to -15C)
- Can be stored at room temperature for up to 12 hours prior to puncture and up to 12 hours after puncture
- Requires 2.2mL of diluent per vial (Please note: The amount of diluent required for this vaccine will be different than what is required for the 5-11 age group. If your clinic plans on administering both Pfizer vaccines, please make sure staff are aware of this.)
- Dose: 0.3 mcg dose (0.2 mL injection volume)

The following are anticipated storage and handling guidelines for the Moderna Infant/Toddler (6 months – 5 years) vaccine:

- 10-dose multidose vial; 100 dose minimum order
- Can be stored 9 months at frozen temperatures (-50C to -15C); 30 days at refrigerated temperatures
- Can be stored up to 12 hours after puncture at room temperature
- Does not require diluent
- · CDPH is awaiting information on injection volume



Number and Timing of Infant/Toddler Doses?

Pfizer (3 micrograms): 3 doses for ages 6 months to under 5 years.



Moderna (25 micrograms): 2 doses for ages 6 months to under 6 years.





Comparison of Infant/Toddler COVID-19 Vaccines

- Press releases indicate that both Pfizer Infant/Toddler (6 months-4 years, maroon cap) and Moderna Infant/Toddler (6 months-5 years, blue cap) vaccines:
 - Generated a comparable immune response to adult immunization (primary endpoint)
 - Reduced the risk of COVID-19 illness

Reporting Shipment Incidents

Friendly reminder: Report shipment incidents for vaccine and ancillary kits the <u>same day</u> the shipment arrived. Once the report has been made in myCAvax, Providers are responsible for reaching out to the manufacturer, or TPR (AmerisourceBergen), for a resolution.

Report Shipment Incidents for:

- damaged/missing shippers or packages
- missing (or surplus) vaccine or missing ancillary kit supplies
- temperature excursions in transit.

Point of Contact for Resolution





Trends in Vaccine Administration


as of June 6, 2022



CDC Strengthens Recommendations and Expands Eligibility for COVID-19 Booster Shots



Following today's meeting of the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices' (ACIP), CDC is expanding eligibility of COVID-19 vaccine booster doses to everyone 5 years of age and older. CDC now recommends that children ages 5 through 11 years should receive a booster shot 5 months after their initial Pfizer-BioNTech vaccination series. Since the pandemic began, more than 4.8 million children ages 5 through 11 have been diagnosed with COVID-19, 15,000 have been hospitalized and, tragically, over 180 have died. As cases increase across the country, a booster dose will safely help restore and enhance protection against severe disease.

In addition, today CDC is strengthening its recommendation that those 12 and older who are immunocompromised and those 50 and older should receive a second booster dose at least 4 months after their first. Over the past month we have seen steady increases in cases, with a steep and substantial increase in hospitalizations for older Americans. While older Americans have the highest coverage of any age group of first booster doses, most older Americans received their last dose (either their primary series or their first booster dose) many months ago, leaving many who are vulnerable without the protection they may need to prevent severe disease, hospitalization, and death.


Pfizer Infant/Toddler (6 months – 4 years, maroon cap):

- 12 months at ULT (-90° to -60° C)
- Do not store at frozen temperatures
- 10 weeks at refrigerated temperatures (2° 8° C)
- 10 dose vial, 10 vial carton, 100 dose minimum order.
- 12 hours prior to puncture at normal room temperature (8° 25° C)
- 12 hours after puncture at normal room temperature (8° 25° C)
- Requires diluent
- TPR will redistribute no later than the week of 27 June
- And now, the label...

- 30 days at refrigerated temperatures (2° 8° C)
- 12 hours after puncture at normal room temperature (2° 25° C)
- No diluent required/but you may not opt-out of ancillary kits, yet
- 10 dose vials, 100 dose minimum order
- 12 hours travel time
- TPR redistribution, in negotiations

Janssen Sunset Plan

- The USG purchased a second batch of Janssen in October 2021.
- December 2021, CDC endorsed ACIP recommendations, expressing a clinical preference for mRNA vaccines.
- March/April 2022, Janssen shelf life extended.
- May 2022, all Janssen released to the CDC's McKesson, Memphis site
- The 11-month shelf life takes the vaccine to February 2023.
- Demand takes it too…
- February 2023 Janssen is gone.
- Novavax: no contract, no money, come August?



Transporting COVID-19 Vaccines

- For the forecasted My Turn release, the VRBPAC meeting is scheduled for June 14th and 15th followed by the ACIP meetings scheduled for June 17th, 18th and 22nd, 23rd and the WSSSRWG will meet shortly after. The first delivery date for the infant/toddler vaccine is scheduled for June 20th.
- By June 15th, My Turn Clinic will have the ability to input infant/toddler Pfizer and Moderna via inline and bulk upload functionality in case of early approval.
- By June 21st, My Turn Public and Clinic will be ready to deploy infant/toddler Pfizer (3 doses) and infant/toddler Moderna (2 doses) through scheduling, walk-ins, and inline/bulk upload.



Pfizer Pediatric (5-11 years, Orange Cap) Booster Data Fix

Clinic Managers and Vaccine Administrators



The My Turn system data fix was processed on June 7th as a part of Release 27 to convert Booster doses administered to this age group during the workaround period to 'Booster' doses.

Any true 'Additional Dose' appointments from the workaround period need to be changed back to 'Additional Dose'. Clinic Managers need to utilize the Edit IIS functionality to update these doses based on tracked identification information from the workaround period.

Pre-Ordering for both Pfizer and Moderna Infant/Toddler products is in progress for LHDs/MCEs and Providers. The minimum order amount is 100 doses for both.

Wave 1:

- Pre-Orders for wave 1 are complete.
- These vaccines will be delivered on Monday, June 20th (Federal Juneteenth Holiday observed).

Wave 2:

- Pre-Orders are open in myCAvax until today Friday, June 10th at 5 PM.
- Don't miss your opportunity to place a Pre-Order!
- Vaccine will be delivered June 21st through June 24th.
- Routine ordering for the new products and small orders timeline (Pfizer only through TPR) will be shared once we receive more information.
- Regular order cadence will continue for existing approved COVID-19 vaccine products.


