



# COVID-19 Vaccine Administration Billing & Reimbursement

# General Information

- Physicians who participate in the CDC COVID-19 Vaccination Program contractually agree to administer regardless of an individual's ability to pay/coverage and billing.
- Both public and private payors are required to cover the vaccine administration **without any patient cost sharing**.
- Physicians will be reimbursed for vaccine administration, but may not seek reimbursement from vaccine recipients, including for CPT 99072 (PPE, cleaning supplies, etc.).
- Recently added, physicians can now bill for counseling (information to be shared once available)



# AMA Current Procedural Technology (CPT) Guidance

In accordance with new vaccine-specific product CPT codes, new vaccine administration codes were created.

\*Physicians should not bill for the vaccine itself at this time. If accidentally submitted, it will be denied.

# Claim Submission and Reimbursement



## Medicare Fee-For-Service Summary

- Claims for Medicare fee-for-service enrollees are reimbursed through Noridian, the Medicare Administrative Contractor
- **Submit claims to Noridian with patient's Medicare FFS (Fee for Service) ID number**
- Reimbursement = \$40 for each dose required.
- Effective June 8, 2021, Medicare allows additional \$35 payment per dose for administering the COVID-19 vaccine in the home for certain Medicare patients.
- To be paid, physicians MUST have Medicare billing privileges.
  - **Request provisional billing privileges during PHE (Public Health Emergency) - call (866)-575-4067**



# Claim Submission and Reimbursement

## Medi-Cal (FFS and Managed Care)

- DHCS carved out COVID-19 vaccine administration benefit from Medi-Cal managed care plans and will reimburse under Medi-Cal FFS system.
- **Submit claims to Medi-Cal FFS with patient's Medi-Cal benefit ID number (not Medi-Cal managed care number).**
  - Obtain Mcal FFS ID number with patient name and SSN at [Medi-Cal Homepage](#).
- Reimbursement - \$40 for each dose required.
- **To be paid, physicians MUST be enrolled in Medi-Cal system.**

# Claim Submission and Reimbursement

## Medi-Cal/Medi-Cal Managed Care reimbursement for FQHCs, RHCs and Tribal FQHCs

- On March 2, 2022, CMS approved the DHCS State Plan Amendment (SPA 21-0020) providing coverage and reimbursement of COVID-19 vaccine administration services provided by Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHC), Rural Health Centers (RHC) and Tribal RHCs.
- Reimbursement rate is **\$67 per shot** for COVID-19 vaccine administration only services.
- The reimbursement rate is retroactive to November 2, 2020.
- Clarification forthcoming on timelines for the Medi-Cal claims system to be ready to process and pay affected COVID-19 vaccine administration services.



# Claim Submission and Reimbursement

## Commercial Health Plans and Insurers

- Submit claims to plan or delegated group as you normally would, unless notified otherwise by health plan/delegated group.
  - **Blue Shield HMO claims-bill Blue Shield directly, rather than delegated group.**
- Submit claims to insurers as you normally would.
- Reimbursement
  - In-network physicians = reimbursed at contracted rate.
  - Out-of-network providers must be reimbursed at a “reasonable rate,” which CMS suggests is the Medicare rate (\$40 for each dose required).

# Claim Submission and Reimbursement



## Commercial Health Plan Reimbursement Caveat:

- SB 510 took effect January 1, 2022, but is retroactive to March 4, 2020.
- Requires payors to cover COVID-19 testing and vaccine administration, regardless of the provider's network status, with no prior auth requirements and no patient cost-sharing.
  - Payors must negotiate a payment rate for in-network providers.
  - Out-of-network services must be reimbursed at a rate that is reasonable when compared to prevailing market rates in the geographic region where the service is rendered.
  - Providers are required to accept this as payment in full and balance billing of patients is not allowed.
- Protects delegated groups/RBOs by prohibiting plans from delegating unfunded financial risk for services unless the parties have negotiated and agreed upon a new provision to the contract.
- Retroactivity of the bill is currently being challenged in the courts.



# Claim Submission and Reimbursement

## Uninsured Patients

- As part of the Provider Relief Fund, physicians were reimbursed for administering COVID-19 vaccine to the uninsured by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA).
- Due to lack of funding, HRSA will only accept claims for vaccine administration until 11:59 p.m. on April 5, 2022.
- **Any vaccine administration claims submitted through their Provider Portal after April 5, 2022, will not be adjudicated for payment.**
- Reimbursement remains at Medicare rates (\$40/shot).





# Appendix: Billing & Reimbursement FAQs

***Q: When it comes to the HMO Plans, the patients that have a medical group or IPA. Who would be responsible to pay the \$40, the plan or the IPA/Med group? Is anyone responsible?***

**CMA:** The plan or IPA would be responsible for paying the contracted rate for the vaccine administration. However, based on a federal inquiry into United Healthcare reimbursing an unreasonably low rate and the payor's agreement to reprocess at the \$40 rate as well as the requirements in SB 510, commercial payors should generally be reimbursing at or around \$40/shot.

***Q: Should we be billing private patients' insurance?***

**CMA:** If the patient has private insurance, yes, the provider should submit a claim to the patient's private insurance.

# Appendix: Uninsured Program-DHCS\* FAQs

***Q: Do the uninsured apply themselves? Do providers apply?***

**DHCS:** For the COVID-19 Uninsured Group, the uninsured or underinsured (folks that have insurance that do not cover COVID-19 testing, testing-related, treatment services) will need to apply. Usually, Providers take the application in the clinic or hospital with the applicant present. Any interested provider will need to enroll as a Medi-Cal qualified provider in any of the [Presumptive Eligibility programs](#) to enroll individuals into the COVID-19 UIG. Providers follow an application process located here: [Medi-Cal: Provider Enrollment](#) to enroll as a Medi-Cal qualified provider.

***Q: How does an independent pharmacy become part of the uninsured program to receive reimbursement?***

**DHCS:** The pharmacy will need to have an arrangement with a Medi-Cal qualified provider under the Medi-Cal Presumptive Eligibility programs to receive reimbursement for services rendered under the COVID-19 UIG.

***Q: Is funding for COVID vaccination for the uninsured different than the underinsured?***

**DHCS:** The COVID-19 UIG covers COVID-19 vaccinations for both uninsured and underinsured.

# Appendix: Uninsured Program- DHCS FAQs

***Q: Does DHCS have an update on when they will provide guidance for FQHCs to submit COVID vaccine claims at the \$67 approved rate?***

**DHCS:** DHCS is currently working on this.

***Q: Will DHCS cover the vaccine administration fee for "uninsured" patients who are on restricted scope Medi-Cal or who are enrolled via the COVID Uninsured Group Program?***

**DHCS:** Yes. DHCS will cover vaccine administration fees for this group.

***Q: Is there a state funding for covid testing now that federal funding for free covid testing is over?***

**DHCS:** The COVID-19 UIG program is funded by federal Medicaid dollars, which is different than HRSA. Please note the COVID-19 UIG program ends the last day of the calendar month in which the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency (PHE) ends.

***Q: Will patients have to apply to DHCS program before receiving treatment or can they apply after as well?***

**DHCS:** It is recommended that individuals apply prior to so they have confirmed eligibility.

# Appendix: Uninsured Program - DHCS FAQs

***Q: Can you please provide more information on the billing after the HRSA deadline of April 5? Are we billing Medi-Cal?***

**DHCS:** The COVID-19 UIG program is different than the HRSA program, however it is similar in scope and covers uninsured individuals and underinsured individuals. It is another pathway for reimbursement for COVID-19 testing, testing-related, and COVID-19 treatment services. Providers billing COVID-19 UIG must be a Medi-Cal qualified provider under Medi-Cal presumptive eligibility programs in order to bill Medi-Cal for the COVID-19 UIG.
