Please review <u>the linked update on mumps outbreaks at colleges</u> also posted at the California Department of Public Health <u>(CDPH) mumps website</u>:

Outbreaks of mumps have been occurring at many colleges and universities in the Eastern and Midwestern United States, and now at <u>the University of San Diego</u>. As students return from their travels during Spring Break, mumps may be introduced onto your campus.

Steps you can take include:

- Encourage all students who have had fewer than two doses of MMR vaccine to catch up in order to reduce their risk.
- Be prepared Review with your staff <u>CDPH guidelines</u> for investigation, testing and isolation of suspect mumps cases.
- If you suspect a case of mumps on your campus, please:
 - Contact your local health department
 - Obtain a buccal swab specimen for pcr testing
 - Isolate the patient from others for 5 days after the onset of parotitis
- Read more on preventing a mumps outbreak on college campuses.
