## Immunization Recommendations for Gay, Bisexual, and Other Men Who Have Sex with Men (GBMSM)<sup>1,2</sup>

Hepatitis A (HepA)	<ul> <li>Havrix<sup>®</sup>, Vaqta<sup>®</sup>: 2 doses, 6 months apart</li> <li>Twinrix<sup>®</sup> (combination HepA/HepB; if ages ≥ 18 years): 3 doses, 0, 1, and 6 months apart</li> </ul>	Outbreaks & <u>GI syndromes</u> caused by enteric pathogens or common sexually transmitted infections (STIs) can occur among sexual/social networks. <b>For People with HIV (PWH)</b> : <u>Check titers &gt; 1 month following</u> <u>HepA series completion</u> .
Hepatitis B (HepB) <sup>3</sup>	<ul> <li>Engerix-B<sup>®</sup>, Recombivax HB<sup>®</sup>, PreHevbrio<sup>®</sup> (if ages ≥ 18 years): 3 doses, 0, 1, and 6 months apart</li> <li>Heplisav-B<sup>®</sup> (if ages ≥ 18 years): 2 doses, 1 month apart</li> <li>Twinrix<sup>®</sup> (combination HepA/HepB; if ages ≥ 18 years): 3 doses, 0, 1, and 6 months apart</li> </ul>	<b>For PWH</b> : Consider <u>double-dose strategy</u> with Engerix-B <sup>®</sup> or Recombivax HB <sup>®</sup> . <u>Check titers &gt;1 month following HepB series</u> <u>completion</u> .
Human papillomavirus (HPV) <sup>3</sup>	<ul> <li>Gardasil 9<sup>®</sup>:</li> <li>ages 9-14 years: 2 doses, 6-12 months apart</li> <li>ages 15-45 years: 3 doses, 0, 1-2, and 6 months apart</li> </ul>	Shared clinical decision-making for ages 27-45 years.
Meningococcal A, C, W, Y conjugate (MenACWY)	<ul> <li>MenQuadfi<sup>®</sup>, Menveo<sup>®</sup>:</li> <li>Adolescents: 2 doses (at ages 11-12 years and 16-18 years); 1 dose (if first dose at ages 16-18 years)</li> <li>Adults at increased risk: 1 or 2 doses depending on risk factors.</li> </ul>	For PWH: 2 doses, 2 months apart. <u>California Department of Public Health (CDPH) recommends</u> <u>MenACWY</u> for MSM and transgender people who have sex with men (1 dose) due to outbreaks of serogroup C invasive meningococcal disease in the United States.
Meningococcal B (MenB)	<ul> <li>Bexsero<sup>®</sup>: 2 doses, 1 month apart</li> <li>Trumenba<sup>®</sup>: 2 doses, 6 months apart</li> </ul>	Shared clinical decision-making for ages 16-23 years. If a patient is receiving MenACWY and MenB vaccines at the same visit, <u>MenABCWY</u> (Penbraya <sup>™</sup> ) may be given instead.
Mpox virus	<ul> <li>JYNNEOS<sup>®</sup>: 2 doses, 28 days apart</li> </ul>	<u>JYNNEOS® can be given intradermally or subcutaneously</u> (SC). If age < 18 years or with history of keloid scars, give SC. <u>Minor Consent for Mpox Treatment</u> .

<sup>1</sup> <u>Comprehensive care for GBMSM</u> includes additional routine immunizations not listed above (see <u>Immunization Schedules | CDC</u>) and a review of both <u>STI</u> and <u>HIV</u> risk and prevention strategies (e.g., <u>doxy-PEP</u>, <u>EPT</u>, HIV <u>PEP/PrEP</u>, <u>U=U/TasP</u>).

<sup>2</sup> Vaccine doses administered ≤ 4 days before the minimum interval or age are considered valid. There is no maximum interval between vaccine doses. See <u>Recommended and minimum ages and intervals between vaccine doses | CDC</u>.

<sup>3</sup>Adolescents age  $\geq$  12 years can seek sexual health services <u>without</u> parental consent. See <u>California Minor Consent and Confidentiality Laws</u>.
