Lead Story: Flu Widespread

As of late January, the CDC reports that nearly all states—including California—are seeing widespread influenza and high influenza-like illness (ILI) activity. Over 8,000 flu-related hospitalizations and 59 pediatric deaths have been reported nationwide, with Boston and New York State having declared a public health state of emergency. California has reported four flu deaths in persons under age 65, as of February 2.

immunization – this year's vaccine appears to match circulating virus strains. As supplies of preservative-free vaccine are dwindling, California has issued an <u>exemption though June to state law</u> to permit children younger than 3 years and pregnant women to receive influenza vaccine regardless of preservative content. Private providers interested in ordering additional vaccine supplies can check the <u>IVATS website</u>.

The CDPH Immunization Branch offers a wealth of <u>resources promoting flu vaccinations and respiratory</u> <u>disease prevention</u>. Use these free, downloadable items to help ensure that clinic staff, patients, students, and all community members understand the importance of preventing influenza.

Statewide Immunization Campaigns

Preteen Vaccine Week 2013 Kicks Off

California's Preteen Vaccine Week (PVW) kicks off February 10-16. This annual observance helps promote adolescent vaccines. California has already



exceeded the federal *Healthy People 2020* goal for adolescent Tdap coverage but has not met goals for other vaccines. Fewer than half of adolescents receive annual influenza immunizations, and the HPV series completion rate for male preteens is just 13%.

At least 22 local health departments, health plans, and coalitions will be participating in 2013 PVW activities. Below are selected highlights. For more details contact Rebeca.Boyte@cdph.ca.gov.

Los Angeles: The Immunization Coalition of Los Angeles County and the LA County Health Department will be hosting immunization clinics at 18 middle schools with several community partners. The goal is to increase immunization rates by 25%.

San Diego County is planning to use social media messages to raise awareness and to send emails to county employees during PVW to remind families that preteens need immunizations.

San Mateo: The Health Plan of San Mateo will send 10-12 year old members a birthday postcard reminding them of the importance of getting the meningococcal, Tdap, and HPV vaccines.

Ventura County will host a school Tdap clinic, partnering with Walmart to offer prizes to kids who bring their immunization record. Also planned is a scavenger hunt where kids look for clues about vaccines.

Riverside and San Bernardino counties will host an Immunization Update on the latest immunization recommendations, expected to attract about 170 health care providers.

Immunization Branch Launches Text4Baby



CDPH's Immunization Branch is launching a pilot program with <u>Text4baby</u>, a free mobile health service for pregnant women and new moms. The six-month pilot, scheduled to start February 23rd, will reach thousands of new California parents to remind them when their baby needs recommended immunizations.

Parents in the program will receive timely text messages, tailored to their baby's birth date, including reminders to come in for shots two weeks before they're due. As a follow-up, parents will be asked to confirm whether their baby was immunized on time.

In the coming months, the Branch is asking providers and community partners to help us reach out to new and expecting parents by asking them to sign up for this FREE service. Parents who would like to receive messages in English can text the word "BABY" to the number 511411; Spanish speakers can text "BEBE" to 511411.

Help raise awareness about this free program by:

- Distributing <u>flyers in English and Spanish</u> in clinics, lobbies, and health fairs. Print materials are available for free.
- Promoting Text4Baby through your <u>Facebook and Twitter networks</u>.
- Embedding this <u>web button</u> in your website.

Providers serving pregnant women and new mothers can also promote the free Text4Baby service with their patients through doctor visits, recorded messages, newsletters, and websites. To learn more about the program, review the <u>frequently asked questions</u> and the <u>message content</u> of all of the text messages that parents receive.

NIIW/TIM Planning for 2013 in Full Swing

National Infant Immunization Week (NIIW) is observed nationally April 20-27. California also observes Toddler Immunization Month (TIM) in May. This year's theme, *Immunization. Power to Protect*, reminds us that vaccines protect children's lives and health.

Childhood Vaccine Schedule Safe

A new report from the Institute of Medicine titled *The Childhood Immunization Schedule and Safety Stakeholder Concerns, Scientific Evidence, and Future Studies*, provides scientific evidence, that the standard childhood immunization schedule is safe. For more details, read the report summary.

Nationally, 2012 was one of the worst years in decades for pertussis. According to the CDC, as of November 21, 2012, 49 states and Washington, DC had more pertussis reported in 2012 than in 2011. California had higher levels in 2010. California data on vaccine-preventable diseases during 2012 is anticipated to be available in March.

CAIR News

CAIR Achieves New Milestones

The California Immunization Registry (CAIR) now includes over 142 million vaccine doses for 13.5 million Californians. In 2012, staff from over 500 new provider practices and 1,300 "read-only" users (typically schools) used the new webinar-based CAIR training.

A Feasibility Study Report to change CAIR to a new software platform by late 2015 has been approved! Vendor bids for the effort will be solicited in 2013. Federal matching-funds (90% federal to 10% state) were approved to upgrade the software and support "Meaningful Use" for seven CAIR regions. New functionality, including online enrollment, validation for Meaningful Use, and patient data uploads are scheduled to be completed by the end of April 2013.



Immunization Registry Stakeholders Meet

On February 4, the California Immunization Coalition (CIC) sponsored a meeting on the immunization registry for stakeholders. Speakers included Mark Sawyer, CIC Board President Jeffrey Goad, Andrew Resignato, and

Provider Education

Reimbursement for Vaccine Counseling

Providers often need to take extra time to discuss parents' concerns about immunization. The American Academy of Pediatrics advises using the ICD-9 vaccine refusal code **V64.0x** and counseling code **V65.40** to <u>reimburse clinic time for vaccine counseling</u>, which will continue to be important as the <u>new state PBE law (AB 2109)</u> comes into effect in 2014.



Healthy Families Program Transition

Children previously insured in California's Healthy Families (HF) Program will be moved into Medi-Cal in phases during 2013. When Healthy Families children move to Medi-Cal, they become eligible to receive Vaccines for Children (VFC) vaccines.

The majority of HF providers already participate in VFC. Current VFC providers will be asked to update their patient estimates to reflect their new Medi-Cal eligible patients from the HF transition. HF providers not currently enrolled in VFC are encouraged to enroll now at www.eziz.org/vfc/enrollment.

- The Ronald P. Bangasser Award is presented to a practicing clinician who exemplifies the leadership, professionalism, and commitment in promoting immunizations.



New Report on Provider Communication Approaches and Needs

The Immunization Branch recently released <u>Immunization Provider</u>
<u>Focus Groups: Communication Approaches and Needs</u>, a report on 12 provider focus groups conducted during 2012. Topics included:

- Successful communication strategies practitioners find successful
- Training and information needs
- Evaluation of existing print and materials.

The 74 participants included pediatricians, pediatric nurse practitioners and physician assistants, family physicians, OB-Gyns, and OB nurses. Twenty recommendations are offered to help providers who immunize children and adolescents.
