California's recent earthquakes, wildfires, and floods are good reminders we always need to be prepared for emergencies.

Some emergencies may require you to close your clinic temporarily. Know what you need to do.

- ✓ Review Section 6 of your [Vaccine Management Plan: Management Plan for Emergencies](#).
- ✓ Double check your vaccine transport supplies. Label them and keep them accessible.
- ✓ Safeguard your vaccines by ALWAYS using VFC-compliant Digital Data Loggers, including during vaccine transport if transport is indicated and if conditions are safe.
