Continue Protecting Young Patients from RSV!



Keep administering nirsevimab (Beyfortus) until March 31st

- Infants are recommended to receive nirsevimab (Beyfortus) to protect against RSV <u>until the end of this month</u>.
 - Got unused, non-expiring doses of nirsevimab? Do NOT send them back. Store and put <u>"Keep for</u> <u>Fall" label</u> on them to keep for fall and administer during the next RSV season.

Also, don't forget to vaccinate against measles!

- Measles cases are increasing nationwide, with California's cases linked to international travel. Ensure your patients are protected with two MMR doses, especially before travel!
- MMR vaccine may be used as young as 6 months of age in an outbreak or prior to international travel.
