

Dear VFA Provider,

Please note that Hepatitis A vaccine is now available to order for your eligible patients. Hepatitis A vaccine doses requested will be approved based on routine vaccine usage history and current inventory to adequately vaccinate your VFA eligible patients. As a reminder, VFA eligibility criteria remain the same during the response to the [Hepatitis A](#) outbreak:

Adults 19 years of age and older who meet one of the following eligibility criteria:

- **Uninsured:** A person without any health insurance coverage (public or private coverage). Unlike VFC, adult patients enrolled in full scope Medi-Cal are considered fully insured, and therefore not eligible for VFA vaccines.
- **Underinsured:** A person who has health insurance, but the coverage does not include vaccines or a person whose insurance covers only selected vaccines. Patients whose health insurance covers the cost of vaccinations but has cost-sharing charges such as deductibles or co-pays are [NOT eligible for VFA vaccines](#). Patients who have Medicare Part B but NOT Part D may be [eligible for certain vaccines](#).
