2019-2020 Child Care Immunization Assessment – Executive Summary California Department of Public Health, Immunization Branch

Immunization requirements for entry into child care facilities help protect children and communities from vaccine-preventable diseases. Each autumn licensed child care facilities in California are required under state immunization laws to report to the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) the status of enrolled children. In recent years there have been changes to these laws and how public health departments assist facilities to implement them. In 2014 and 2015 Assembly Bill (AB) 2109 added requirements for exemptions to required immunizations based on personal beliefs. 2019-2020 is the fourth full school year that entrants have been subject to Senate Bill (SB) 277, which no longer permits them to receive such personal beliefs exemptions (PBEs). Beginning in the 2015-2016 school year, many public health departments in California have increased their assistance to facilities in implementing immunization requirements.

The proportion of children attending child care facilities in 2019-2020 reported to <u>have received</u> <u>all required vaccines</u> is 95.8%, a 0.1% percentage point decrease from the 2018-2019 school year and a 6.6 percentage point increase over the six years since 2013-2014. The 2019-2020 rate of 95.8% is among the highest reported for the current set of immunization requirements for child care facilities, which began in the 2001-2002 school year.

Completion rates for each <u>specific immunization series</u> decreased 0.2 percentage points for Diphtheria, Tetanus and Pertussis (DTP) vaccine, Polio vaccine, and Varicella (Var) vaccine. In 2019-2020, 6 (10%) counties, reported fewer than 95% of their children as having had one or more doses of MMR vaccine, compared to 5 (9%) in 2018-2019, and 17 (29%) counties in 2015-2016.

The proportion of children reported as <u>conditional entrants</u> increased from 1.6% in 2018-2019 to 1.7% in 2019-2020, a 0.1 percentage point increase over one year and a 5.7% percentage point decrease over the four years since 2014-2015. The rate of 1.7% is among the lowest reported for the current set of immunization requirements to attend child care.

The proportion of children reported with <u>PBEs</u> decreased in 2019-2020 from 0.1% to 0%. Under SB 277, PBEs had remained valid for children who entered child care before 2016 and continued in child care in later years. Previously under measures specified in AB 2109, the rate of PBEs had decreased from 2.9% in 2013-2014 to 2.3% in 2015-2016.

Compared to 2018-2019, in 2019-2020 the proportion of children reported as:

- Having permanent medical exemptions increased from 0.7% to 0.8%.
- Lacking immunizations for <u>other reasons specified under SB 277</u>, specifically, receipt of services in an individualized education program, remained at 0.1%.
- Being overdue for required immunizations remained at 1.5%.

CDPH and local health departments in California continue to closely monitor immunization coverage and to support facilities in protecting the health of their children and communities.

2019-2020 Child Care Immunization Assessment – Technical Notes

Introduction

Each autumn licensed child care facilities in California are required to report compliance of children enrolled in their facilities with California School Immunization Laws (California Health and Safety Code Sections 120325-120375). This report summarizes data for the 2019-2020 school year reported by public, private and Head Start facilities statewide (Table 1, Figures 1-11) and by county (Tables 2-11, Figures 10 and 11).

In the 2014-2015 and 2015-2016 school years, entrants were subject to <u>Assembly Bill (AB) 2109</u>, which added stipulations for exemptions to required immunizations based on personal beliefs. 2019-2020 was the fourth full school year that entrants were subject to <u>Senate Bill (SB) 277</u>, which no longer permitted them to receive such personal beliefs exemptions (PBEs).

Methods

During the autumn of 2019, California child care facilities registered with the Department of Social Services, Community Care Licensing Division and the California Department of Education reported to the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) data on children 2 through 5 years of age enrolled in the 2019-2020 school year. Based on their immunization status, school staff classified children into the following categories:

- Received all required immunizations, including the following doses:
 - o 4 or more of Diphtheria, Tetanus and Pertussis (DTP) vaccine
 - o 3 or more of Polio vaccine
 - o 1 or more of Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccine
 - o 1 or more of *Haemophilus influenzae* type b (Hib) vaccine
 - o 3 or more of Hepatitis B (Hep B) vaccine, and
 - 1 or more of Varicella (Var) vaccine or a history documented by a physician of having had chickenpox.
- Conditional entrants who had:
 - Not received all required doses but were not overdue for required doses, or
 - o A temporary medical exemption to one or more required immunizations.

Conditional entrants are required to receive additional doses after entry.

- Have a permanent medical exemption (PME) to one or more required immunizations.
- Entered a child care facility prior to the 2016-2017 school year with a <u>personal beliefs</u> <u>exemption</u> (PBE) and continued in child care during the 2019-2020 school year. Under SB 277, since 2016 PBEs have no longer been an option for children entering child care.
- Other children lacking immunizations. Under SB 277, children who have an
 individualized education program (IEP) may continue to receive all necessary services
 identified in their IEP regardless of their immunization status. Children were classified in
 this category if they lacked required immunizations and did not meet the criteria for other
 categories.
- Children <u>overdue</u> for one or more required immunizations and subject to exclusion from child care attendance until the overdue requirements have been met.

To simplify reporting, in 2015-2016 and earlier school years any immunizations received by children with PBEs or PMEs were not reported in the completion rates of each specific required immunization series (e.g., 4+ DTP, 1+ MMR, etc.). To improve accuracy, CDPH has requested

facilities to include these doses when reporting completion rates of specific immunizations since the 2016-2017 school year.

Due to rounding, total figures may differ from the sums of their components. Differences were calculated between exact figures, potentially varying at times by 0.1% from the differences between rounded figures.

Results

The number of children enrolled in licensed child care facilities in California whose immunization status was reported increased by 0.4 percentage points from 517,869 in 2018-2019 to 519,852 in the 2019-2020 school year (Table 1). The number of facilities that reported increased by 2.3 percentage points from 9,808 in 2018-2019 to 10,032, and the number that did not report decreased from 771 in 2018-2019 to 624 in 2019-2020 (Tables 1 and 2). Private facilities accounted for 57% of all facilities.

Figures 1-5 show trends for children in public, private, and Head Start facilities reported as having: received all required immunizations; entered conditionally; PMEs; PBEs; and completed specific immunization series. Figures 6-9 display for recent school years the distribution of major reporting categories for children reported from: all facilities; public facilities; private facilities; and Head Start facilities.

All required immunizations: Of 519,852 children whose facilities reported their status, 498,045 (95.8%) had received all required immunizations, a decrease from the previous school year of 0.1 percentage points (Table 1) and an increase over the four school years since 2015-2016 of 5.3 percentage points (Figures 1, 6).

For counties reporting at least 50 children, the highest rates of at least 98% were reported in Colusa, Modoc, Glenn, Imperial, Tulare, and San Mateo counties (Tables 3-5). In 2019-2020, 6 (10%) of 58 counties in California reported fewer than 90% of their children as having received all required vaccines, compared to 4 (7%) counties in 2018-2019 (Tables 4 and 5, Figure 10) and 28 (48%) counties in 2015-2016.

As in past years, the highest proportion of children reported as having had all required immunizations attended Head Start facilities (98.1%), compared to public (95.6%) and private (95.5%) facilities (Table 1, Figures 1 and 7-9).

<u>Specific immunizations</u>: Completion rates for specific immunizations varied between 97.4% for DTP vaccine and 98.5% for Hib vaccine (Tables 1 and 11, Figure 5). Completion rates for specific immunizations were the same for Hib and Hep B vaccines and decreased by 0.2 percentage points for DTP, Polio and Var (Tables 1 and 9, Figure 5).

For MMR, 99.5% of children at Head Start facilities, 98.6% at public facilities, and 97.8% at private facilities were reported as having received at least one dose, similar to rates in in these settings for 2018-2019. In 2019-2020, 6 (10%) counties reported fewer than 95% of their children as having had one dose of MMR (Table 11, Figure 11), compared to 5 (9%) in 2018-2019, and 17 (29%) counties in 2015-2016.

<u>Conditional entrants</u>: Over the last five school years, the proportion of children reported as conditional entrants decreased from 7.4% in 2014-2015 to 1.7% in 2019-2020 (Table 1, Figures

2 and 6). Compared to the 2018-2019 school year, the proportion of conditional entrants in 2019-2020 increased by 0.1 percentage points. The rate of conditional entrants remained the same in public facilities but increased 0.1 percentage points in both private and Head Start facilities (Table 1).

Of the 1.7% of children reported as conditional entrants in 2019-2020, 0.2% were reported as having had a temporary medical exemption, a 0.1 percentage point decrease since 2018-2019.

<u>PMEs</u>: The percentage of children with PMEs increased from 0.7% in 2018-2019 to 0.8 percentage points (Tables 1 and 7, Figure 3), reflecting an increase from 3,229 (1.0%) to 3,315 (1.0%) in the number of children with PMEs at private facilities, from 89 (0.1%) to 118 (0.2%) in Head Start facilities (Figures 3 and 9), and from 499 (0.4%) to 526 (0.4%) at public facilities (Figures 3, 7 and 8).

<u>PBEs</u>: With the option of PBEs available to prior entrants but no longer to new entrants since 2016 under SB 277, the percentage of children with PBEs decreased to 0.0% in 2019-2020, compared to 0.1% in 2018-2019, 2.3% in 2015-2016 and 2.9% 2013-2014 (Table 8, Figures 4 and 6). In 2019-2020 PBE rates declined over one year from 0.2% to 0% in private facilities and remained at 0% in public as well as in Head Start facilities (Table 1, Figures 7-9). The rates of residual PBEs continue to vary by county, within a range of 0.0%-1.9% (Table 8).

Other children lacking required immunizations: The proportion of children reported to be lacking one or more required immunizations and to receive services specified in an IEP remained at 0.1% in 2019-2020 (Tables 1, 3, and 9, Figure 6).

Overdue: The percentage of children reported as being overdue for one or more immunizations remained at 1.5% in 2019-2020 (Tables 1, 3 and 10, Figure 6). The percentage of overdue children in public facilities increased from 1.7% to 1.9% but did not change in private (1.6%) or Head Start (0.4%) facilities (Tables 1 and 10, Figures 7-9).

<u>Combined categories</u>: Children who are required to receive all mandated vaccines are reported in three categories: having received all required vaccines; conditional entrants; and being overdue for required doses. The children who were reported in the sum of these three categories increased from 99.0% in 2018-2019 to 99.1% in 2019-2020.

Conversely the sum of children reported as not having to receive all required immunizations because of PMEs, PBEs, or for other criteria specified in SB 277, decreased from 1.0% in 2018-2019 to 0.9% in 2019-2020; the combined rate decreased from 1.2% to 1.1% for private facilities, remained at 0.8% for public facilities, and increased from 0.1% to 0.2% in Head Start facilities. Over time the combined rate has been 3.2% in 2013-2014, 2.8% in 2015-2016, 1.5% in 2016-2017, and 0.9% in 2019-2020.

Discussion

In comparing the 2019-2020 school year to 2018-2019, the proportion of children reported to enter child care in California after receiving all required immunizations decreased by 0.1 percentage points to 95.8%, following an increase by 5.5 percentage points between the 2014-2015 and 2016-2017 school years. The 2019-2020 rate of 95.8% is among the highest reported to CDPH since varicella vaccine became the most recent addition to the immunizations required for children in the 2001-2002 school year. The number of children (519,852) whose status was

collected in 2019-2020 remains at amongst the highest reported since the 2001-2002 school year.

The 6.6 percentage point increase in the receipt of all required vaccines since 2013-2014 is similar in magnitude to a 5.8% percentage point decrease in children reported as conditional entrants. The current reported rate of conditional entrants, 1.7% is among the lowest reported for the current panel of required immunizations in place since the 2001-2002 school year.

Since 2015 local health departments and CDPH have intensified efforts to educate child care staff on the proper use of conditional entrance criteria based on the <u>Conditional Admission</u> <u>Immunization Schedule</u>. It is likely that these measures to promote compliance have contributed to the decreases in children reported as conditional entrants and the increases in those reported as having received all required vaccines. These changes might also be attributable to an increased awareness of the risks of vaccine-preventable diseases and benefits of immunization.

It is possible that children who in previous school years would have been inaccurately categorized as conditional entrants represent some of the 1.5% of entrants reported as overdue in 2019-2020. Many facilities that in more recent school years have reported children as being overdue for required immunizations had previously reported higher rates of conditional entrants; they have also reported low rates for the other categories of children without all required immunizations. Continued efforts to educate facilities and support immunization services might further reduce the number of children who are categorized at the beginning of the future school years either as conditional entrants or overdue; in sum these categories account for 3.3% of children reported in 2019-2020, compared to 3.1% of children reported in 2018-2019.

With the additional measures required under AB 2109 for requesting PBEs during 2014 and 2015, the rate of PBEs decreased from 2.9% in 2013-2014 to 2.3% in 2015-2016. With the implementation of SB 277 and the cessation of PBEs for new (but not prior) entrants, the percentage of children with PBEs in 2019-2020 has decreased to 0.0% (216). As children currently in child care advance to kindergarten, the number of children with PBEs is expected to soon decrease to zero. In 2019-2020, 0.8% of children were reported with PMEs, and another 0.1% lacked required immunizations under other criteria introduced in SB 277. The proportion of entrants reported as not having had required immunizations because of PBEs, PMEs or other criteria related to SB 277 has decreased from 3.2% in 2013-2014 to 0.9% in 2019-2020. Future assessments will continue to monitor these categories.

Despite the improvements in reported immunization rates, children in facilities and communities with lower rates remain at higher risk of contracting and transmitting vaccine preventable diseases. In 2019-2020, 6 (10%) of 58 counties in California reported rates of children with all required vaccines that are below 90% (Figure 10), compared to 4 (7%) in 2018-2019, and 28 (48%) in 2015-2016. 6 (10%) counties, compared to 5 (9%) in 2018-2019 and 17 (29%) in 2015-2016, reported fewer than 95% of their children as having had one dose of MMR (Table 11, Figure 11). As an additional source of vulnerability, recent changes to California's school immunization laws did not apply to earlier cohorts of children who are no longer of school age. Unimmunized older children and adults were amongst those who caught measles in the Disneyland outbreak in 2014 and 2015. For these individuals, decisions that were made in previous decades to decline immunization have had lingering consequences for themselves and their communities.

Limitations

This report is subject to limitations that include:

- 624 California child care facilities, including 326 private facilities, 156 public facilities, 27
 Head Start facilities and 115 facilities of unknown type did not report their immunization
 data; in the absence of reporting, CDPH does not know how many of them enrolled
 children this year or the immunization status of any enrollees. As private facilities have
 reported lower coverage rates than have public or Head Start facilities, decreased
 reporting by private facilities might contribute to increases in overall rates.
- Part of the relative improvements in the completion rates of specific immunization series starting in the 2016-2017 school year may have been due to the inclusion in reporting of doses received by partially immunized children who had PBEs or PMEs to other required immunizations. In reporting to CDPH during prior school years, doses received by children with exemptions were not included in completion rates for any specific vaccine. This may have resulted in underestimates of completion rates for specific vaccines in prior years and overestimates of their increases between recent and prior years. The magnitude of the resultant increase to the rate of any immunization series in 2019-2020 resulting from this change in reporting could be no greater than 0.9%, the total of children reported in categories as not having to receive all required immunizations (PMEs, PBEs or other criteria specified in SB 277). This reporting change should not have affected rates, or changes in rates, for the category of having received all required vaccines.
- The timing of immunization is often not included in the assessment criteria; if doses were given at inappropriate ages or intervals, the reported rates may overestimate levels of immunity.
- It is possible that some immunization records provided to facilities have been incomplete. The presence of incomplete records would underestimate immunization coverage. Any improvements over time in completion of records since the time of reporting would increase estimates of coverage.
- Changes over time in the quality of reporting by facilities are another potential explanation for changes in immunization rates.

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- Table 11. Number and Percentage of Children with Required Immunizations by Vaccine Series, 2019-2020, by County




Figure 1. Percentage of Children with All Required Immunizations, by Facility Type and School Year, 2012-2013 to 2019-2020




Figure 2. Percentage of Conditional Entrants into Child Care, by Facility Type and School Year, 2012-2013 to 2019-2020




Figure 3. Percentage of Children with Permanent Medical Exemptions (PMEs), by Facility Type and School Year, 2012-2013 to 2019-2020




Figure 4. Percentage of Children with Personal Belief Exemptions (PBEs), by Facility Type and School Year, 2012-2013 to 2019-2020






Figure 5. Percentage of Children with Specific Required Immunizations by Series and School Year, 2012-2013 to 2019-2020







Figure 9. Percentage of Children in Head Start Facilities by Reported Admission Status by School Year, 2018-2019 and 2019-2020.




Figure 10. Children with All Required Immunizations, by County, 2018-2019 and 2019-2020 School Years




Figure 11. Children with 1 or More Doses of MMR Vaccine, by County, 2018-2019 and 2019-2020 School Years
