



What Are the Reporting Requirements?

Requirements at www.cdph.ca.gov/shotsforschool

- All public and private licensed childcares and schools are required to submit an Annual Immunization Assessment report.
- Cohorts include child care centers with children ages 2-5 years; schools with kindergartens and 7th grades





What Are the Reporting Requirements?

Shots Required for TK/K and 7th Grade

CALIFORNIA IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR

- 1. Requirements for K-12 admission also apply to transfer
- 2. Combination vaccines (e.g., MMRV) meet the requirements for individual component vaccines. Doses of DTP count towards the DTaP requirement.
- 3. Any vaccine administered four or fewer days prior to the minimum required age is valid.
- 4. Three doses of polio vaccine meet the requirement if one dose was given on or after the 4th birthday.
- 5. Four doses of DTaP meet the requirement if at least one dose was given on or after the 4th birthday. Three doses meet the requirement if at least one dose of Tdap, DTaP, or DTP vaccine was given on or after the 7th birthday (also meets the 7th-12th grade Tdap requirement. See fn. 8.)
- One or two doses of Td vaccine given on or after the 7th birthday count towards the K-12 requirement.
- 6. For 7th grade admission, refer to Health and Safety Code section 120335, subdivision (c).
- 7. Two doses of measles, two doses of mumps, and one dose of rubella vaccine meet the requirement, separately or combined. Only doses administered on or after the 1st birthday meet the requirement.
- 8. For 7th-12th graders, at least one dose of pertussis-containing vaccine is required on or after the 7th birthday.
- 9. For children in ungraded schools, pupils 12 years and older are subject to the 7th grade advancement requirements.
- 10. The varicella requirement for seventh grade advancement expires after June 30, 2025.

DTaP/Tdap = diphtheria toxoid, tetanus toxoid, and acellular pertussis vaccine Hep B = hepatitis B vaccine

MMR = measles, mumps, and rubella vaccine

Varicella = chickenpox vaccine

INSTRUCTIONS:

California schools are required to check immunization records for all new student admissions at TK /Kindergarten through 12th grade and all students advancing to 7th grade before entry. Students entering 7th grade who had a personal beliefs exemption on file must meet the requirements for TK/K-12 and 7th grade. See shotsforschool.org for more information.








What is each student's immunization status?

- Determine the immunization status for each student one by one, by placing each Blue Card in the groups:
- Stack the Blue Cards into 2 separate piles:
 - "All Required Immunizations"
 - "Missing Doses"
 - Sort students "Missing Doses" into their separate piles that describe why they are missing immunizations.



Reporting Data for Kindergarten and 7th Grade



The California Health and Safety Code Section 120325-75 requires students to provide proof of immunization for school and child care entry. Additionally, California Health and Safety Code Section 120375 and California Code of Regulation Section 6075 require all schools and child care facilities to assess and report annually the immunization status of their enrollees.


Reporting Site Dashboard







- In this example, an error message pops up because two fields have no number entered. If there are zero students in these categories, enter 0.



Submitted Report – Email Notifications

- New feature: when a user submits or edits a report, a confirmation email will be sent to:
 - school users that have the school/facility in their "Assigned Schools/Facilities" list,
 - school/facility's "Administrative Email" address, and
 - school/facility's "Facility/School Email"

 All cohorts must be submitted for a school before the confirmation email is sent



Editing a Report after Submission

- Submitted reports can be edited until the site closes.
- Log in, select your school, select View & Print Report, click on Edit.
- May increase "All Required Vaccines" rate


CAIR-ME Background

- Starting January 1, 2021, all new medical exemptions (MEs) must be issued using <u>CAIR-ME</u> (<u>California Health and Safely Code Section 120372</u>)
- CAIR-ME is a web-based application that allows:
 - Physicians to create and issue a printed or pdf version of a ME
 - Schools to view, check the status, print and export ME data for children that attend the school
 - LHDs to view, check the status and export ME data for children that live or attend school in the jurisdiction, for schools and childcare in the jurisdiction, and of physicians that practice in the jurisdiction



CAIR-ME Background

- CAIR-ME is <u>NOT</u>:
 - School immunization reporting site
 - SCRL (School and Childcare Roster Lookup)
 - CAIR (California Immunization Registry)
- Separate application with its own log-in: https://cair.cdph.ca.gov/exemptions/home
- All schools with a student who has a ME issued in CAIR-ME should have a registered user(s)
 - To register for a CAIR-ME account, email <u>Medicalexemptions@cdph.ca.gov</u>





What you get with a CAIR-ME Account

- Be able to validate the information and the status of the ME
- New: Be able to print a paper or PDF copy for the child's file
- Assist with gathering annual school reporting data
- Download aggregate data on MEs for your facility
- Receive email communications when a ME is:
 - Expired
 - Cancelled
 - Revoked




If a medical exemption (ME)is issued through CAIR-ME, does that mean it has been reviewed and approved by CDPH?

- By law, MEs may be reviewed by CDPH in the following circumstances:
 - The child attends a school or childcare facility that did not report immunization coverage rates
 - The child attends a school or childcare facility with a reported immunization coverage rate of ≤95%
 - The ME was issued by a doctor that has issued <u>></u>5 MEs during the calendar year
- An ME is valid as soon as it is issued by the doctor, but it may not remain valid if it comes up for review and is determined to not meet appropriate guidelines



ME Review Process





Steps to follow when you receive a medical exemption from CAIR-ME:


- 1. Verify the child's name, date of birth, and grade span are correct.
 - If any of this information is incorrect, the ME is not valid
 - The doctor will have to issue a new ME
- 2. Verify that your school's name is on the form.
 - If school information is incorrect, the parent will have to log into their CAIR-ME account to update the school information



Steps to follow when you receive a medical exemption from CAIR-ME (continued):

- 3. If you do not have a CAIR-ME account, you can request access by emailing medicalexemptions@cdph.ca.gov.
- 4. Verify the exemption is in "Issued" status in CAIR-ME.
 - If the ME is not in issued status, it is not valid, and you cannot accept it.











Medical Exemption FAQs

Are medical exemptions filed for children in attendance at a California child care facility or school before 2021 valid in later years?

A medical exemption filed at a pre-kindergarten facility or school remains valid until the earliest of:

- When the child enrolls in the next grade span (TK/K-6th grade, 7th-12th grade)
- The expiration date specified in a temporary medical exemption
- Revocation of the exemption because the issuing physician has been subject to disciplinary action from the physician's licensing entity



A parent tells you that their child has had chickenpox and doesn't need the vaccine. Do they need an exemption?

- Children must either have two doses of varicella or a medical exemption to comply with the requirement.
- Notes from physicians, laboratory reports or "had disease" noted on immunization records MAY NOT be used to assess compliance with immunization requirements.



Why can't I see a student's medical exemption when I log in to CAIR-ME?

- MEs are not acceptable until the correct school or childcare facility is listed in CAIR-ME.
- If you can't see a ME when you log in, it usually means that the ME is not associated with your school yet.
- Parents need to log in to CAIR-ME to update the school information.
- Once updated you should be able to see and print the exemption.

Does Your Child Need a Medical Exemption?





New medical exemptions (ME) for school and child care entry must be issued through CAIR-ME (California Immunization Registry - Medical Exemption website).

Medical exemptions can only be issued by MDs or DOs licensed in California and must meet applicable Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), <u>Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP)</u>, and American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) criteria.

Steps to obtain a ME for school/child care entry:

- Create an account in <u>CAIR-ME</u> (CAIR.CDPH.CA.gov/exemptions/home) and apply for an exemption.
- 2. Share the application number with your child's physician.
- The physician can register for an account in CAIR-ME and log in to issue the ME.
- 4. Once the ME is issued, the physician prints the form and provides a copy to you to give to your child's school or child care facility.
 Note: The requirement to issue all new medical exemptions through CAIR-ME includes exemptions for children who have had documented chickenpox disease.
